Klamath Falls and Wilsonville

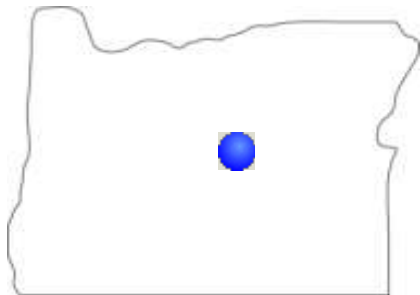

U.S. Census Bureau

- A **bachelor's degree** increases your chance of employment by nearly **50%**.
- Over the course of the average adult's working life, someone with a **bachelor's degree** will earn **\$1.9 million dollars more** than someone with a high school diploma.

More education = higher earnings

High School Diploma or GED	\$34,736
Some College	\$38,532
Associate's Degree	\$41,184
Bachelor's Degree	\$57,252
Master's Degree & Higher	\$78,971

Financial Aid

Many options, including 3 types of aid

State and federal:

Grants, loans, work study and other opportunities.

Institutional (College):

Scholarships and loans granted by the specific university you plan to attend.

Private:

Scholarships from organizations and individuals that can be used at any college

How to Apply for Aid

State and federal aid:

Apply beginning **OCTOBER 1, 2016** online at fafsa.ed.gov

Institutional (college) aid:

Check each university's admissions website for deadlines and details.

Private aid:

Ask a guidance counselor to help you find these opportunities.

Freshman Admission:

Basic Requirements

Here are the basic requirements for all of Oregon's public universities:*

1. Graduate from a public or accredited private high school
2. Meet a satisfactory minimum average GPA
3. Complete the SAT or ACT
4. Complete a minimum of 15 Subject Requirements

Be sure that you visit campus websites or ask an admissions counselor about campus-specific requirements.

**If you don't meet these requirements, you can still apply; ask a counselor for details.*

Subject Requirements

Complete the minimum 15 subject requirements:

- ✓ 4 Units English
- ✓ 3 Units Math (through Algebra II)
- ✓ 3 Units Social Studies
- ✓ 3 Units Science
- ✓ 2 Units of the Same
Second Language

These subjects need to be passed with a C- or better.
