Elementary:

During week one we focused on creating relationships and making connections between students and staff. Middle School:

It was a great start for students and staff and the 2019-20 school year feels well underway. The wide-eyed group of new 6th grade students transitioned really well and appear to already feel very comfortable in moving independently throughout the building. A big thanks to our amazing staff and our WEB leaders for getting our school year off to a great start.

This week, improved safety measures were installed and operational for students that bike or walk the crosswalk connecting Brook Peterson Park and WMS. Families that pick up at the end of the day have observed our district safety specialist, Ben Karnes, at the crosswalk directing after school traffic and keeping students safe in the crosswalk. Last year he communicated the need for improved signage to alert motorists and on Wednesday new safety signage was operational. The additional signs and blinking lights were installed by the City of Waconia in partnership with ISD 110.
