Canada Day Fireworks - Lesson Plan

Materials

- Black and blue paper
- Toilet paper rolls, cut into 'fringe shape with different length of fringe (large to small)
- Different colours of 'firework' paint (yellow, white, green, pink, etc)

Directions

- Start by cutting a toilet paper roll into 2" long fringes. Create a few other lengths that can be overlapped to create a 3D effect
- Open up the fringe so that it sits flat against the table, and place the roll on to a paper plate that has been covered in a layer of tempera paint
- Stamp on to either black or blue paper
- Start printing with the largest fireworks cardboard fan first and print over the top with the next size down to the smallest.
- Create a fireworks using the smallest cardboard fan first overlapping the paint with the next biggest until the largest.
- Create single coloured fireworks with no overlapping with several colours.
