Medical Terminology Magazine

In today's society there are a number of jobs available in the Medical field

As enterprising young medical students, you realize that a more people need to have several options in mind about your medical career. Your class has been instructed to produce a magazine that is filled with articles relating to several jobs in medicine. The Article must include any 8 medical terms associated with with job. Each term must be defined and broken apart.

This is a group activity. Each group will together write one article. One member of the group is responsible for the cover design, one member is responsible for the advertising within the magazine (a total of 2 ads) and one member is responsible for the table of contents. Every student needs to make sure they contribute to the written article.

- Each article should be approximately 300-500 words long, and the author needs to make sure the job is described in full detail. Please make sure to include schools that offer degrees associated to the job, how much is the typical salary, how long it takes to get the degree, job outlook.
- In preparing the article, library and Internet research should be utilized, using current materials. At the conclusion of each article, **at least two** sources should be cited, using proper referencing format.
- Once all articles and visuals are complete, the group will assemble the magazine for publication. Work must be typed and articles must include at least two visual aids (clip art, photos, charts, maps, etc.).
