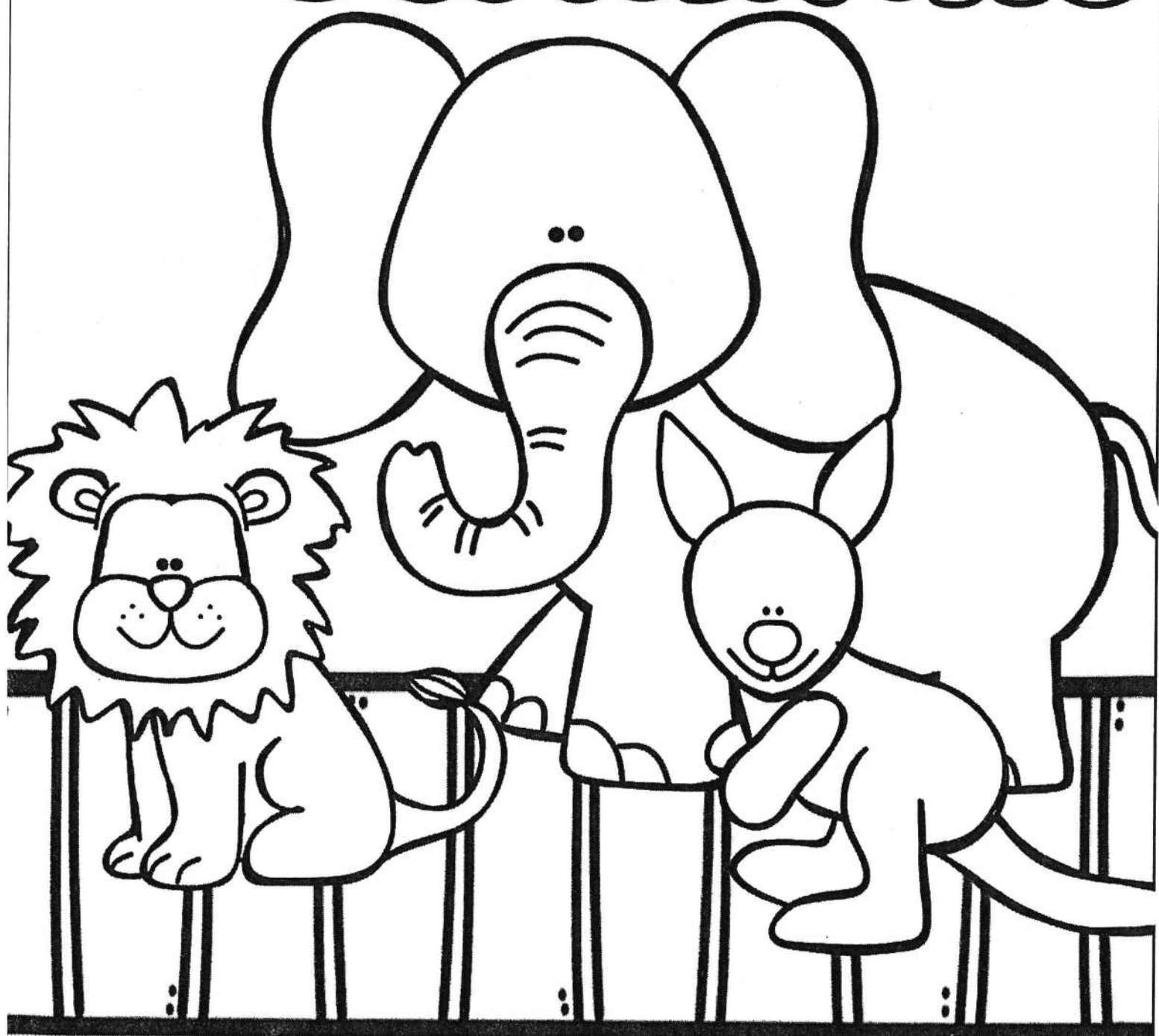


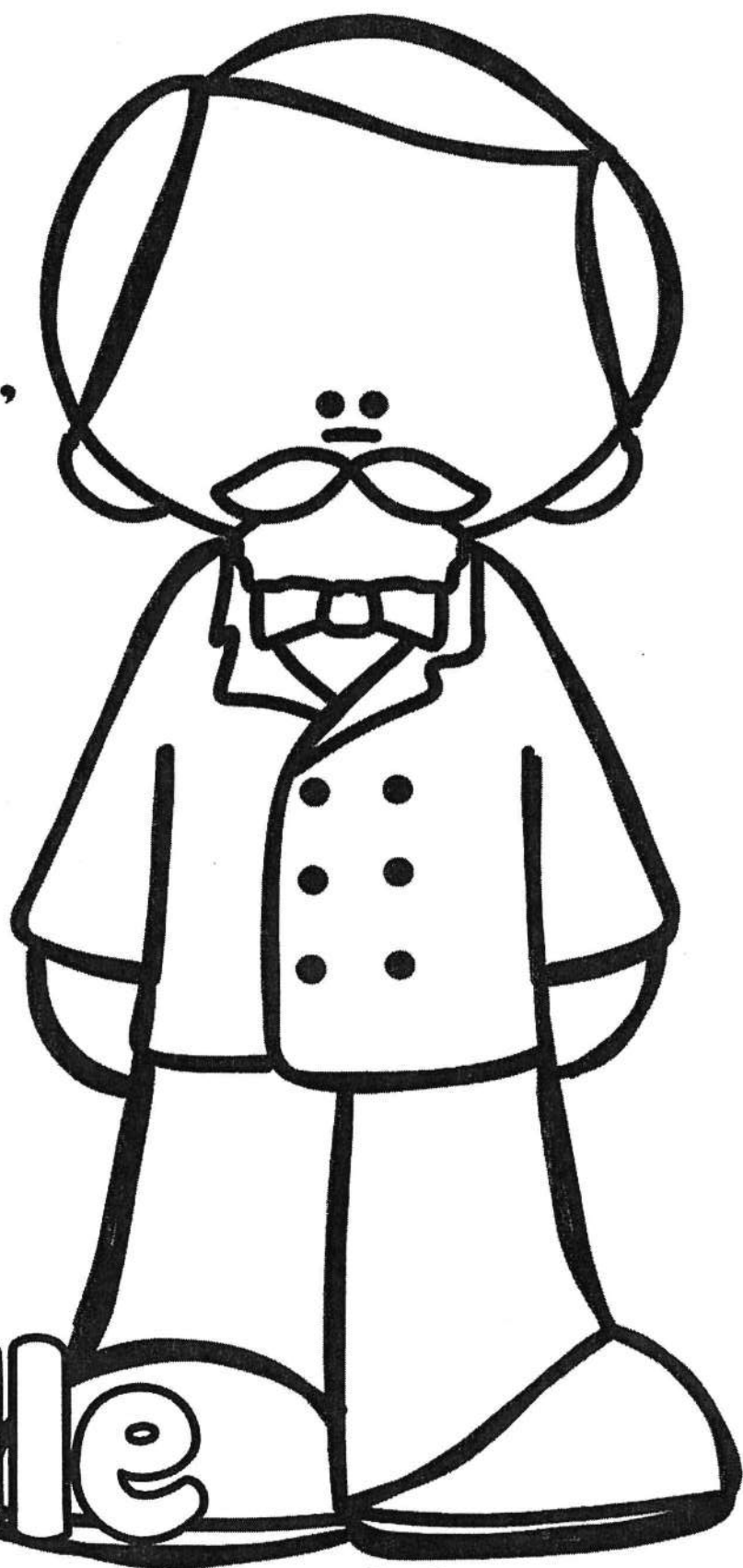
# CARNIVAL of the Animals

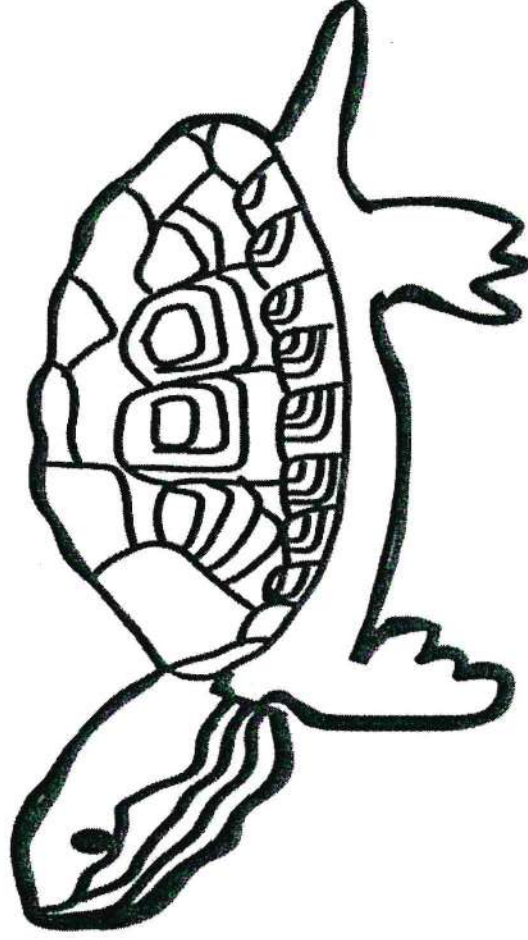


# Tortoises

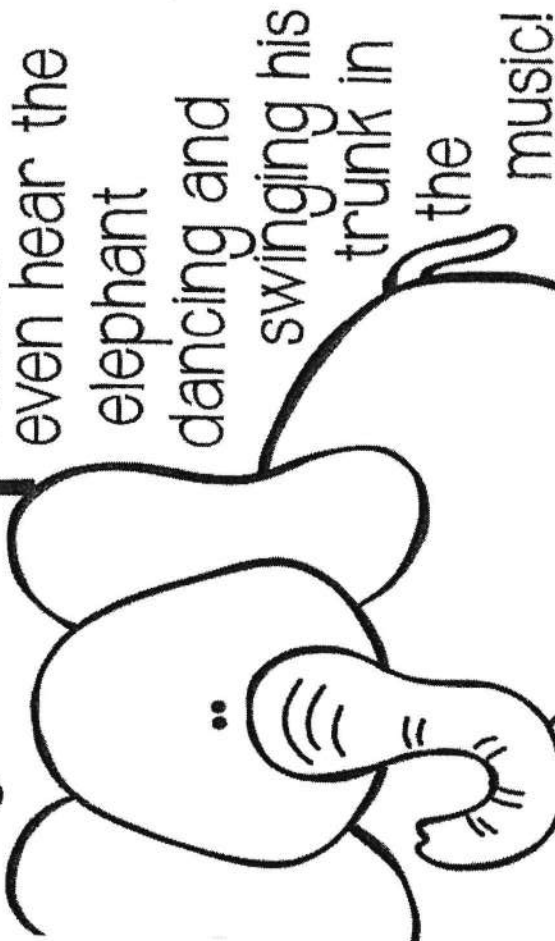

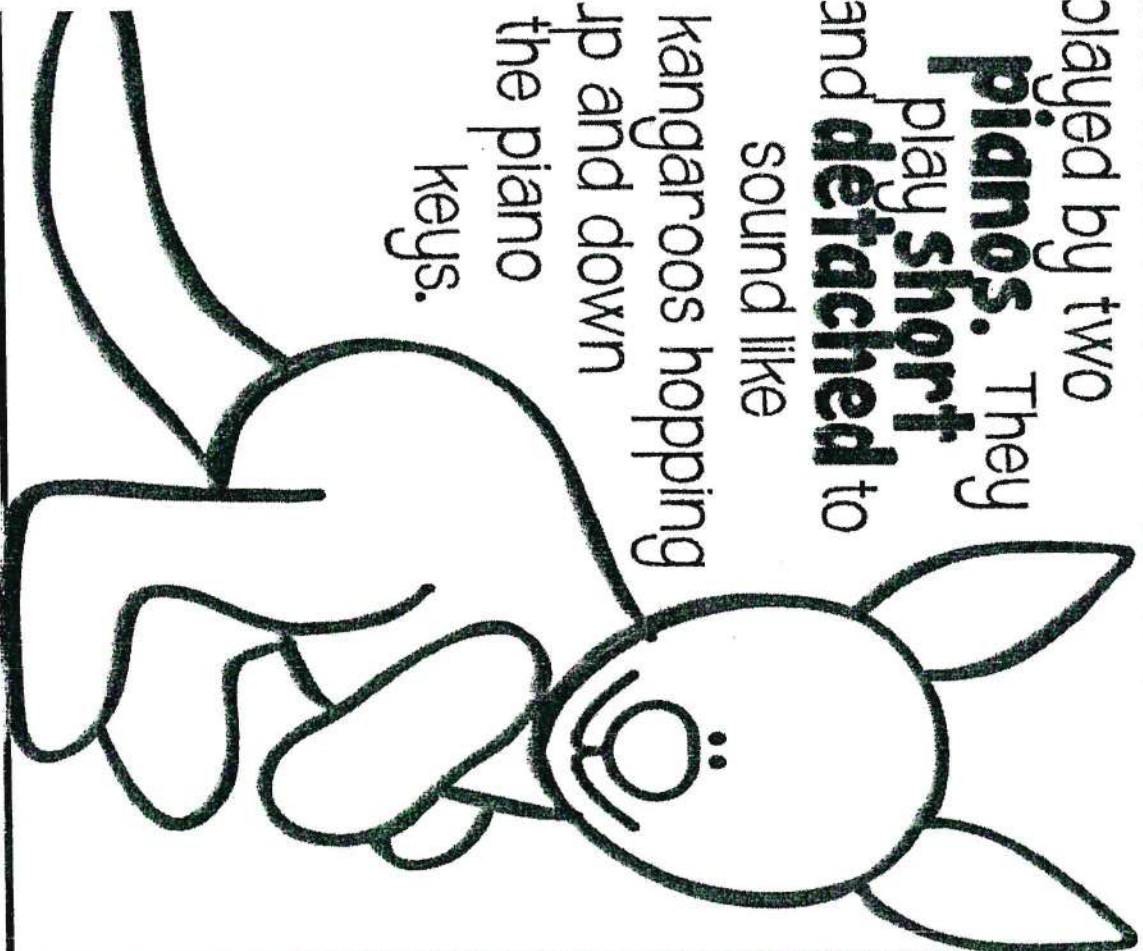
# Kangaroos

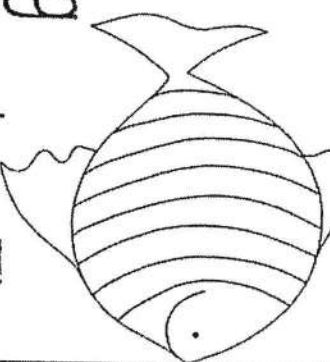

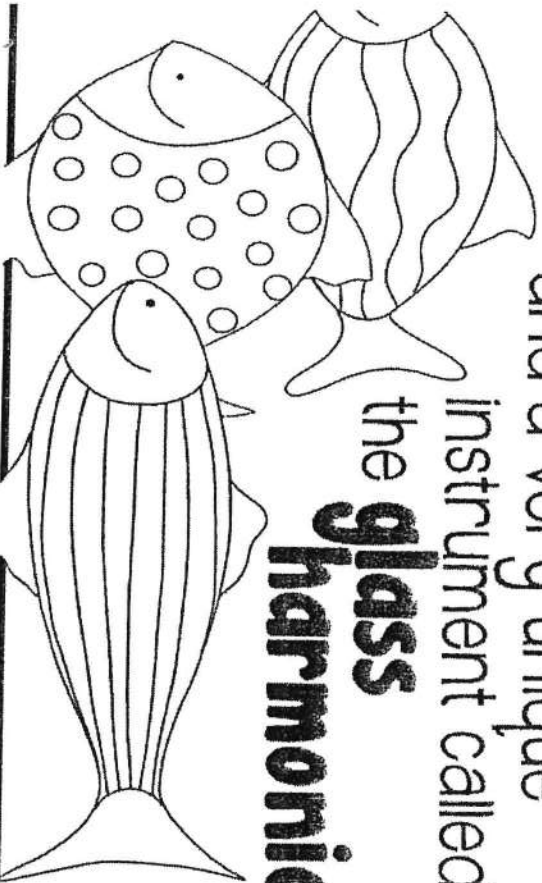
