



 - The closer to the top of the caste system pyramid means that you have built up enough good karma from many lifetimes. You have fulfilled your dharma and your soul is close to being reunited with Brahma (most pure)
- NOT A or D because the caste system is more of a religious organization of society...not about jobs and wealth (like the US social classes)

Brahmins



- ☐ Purpose is to help people of other castes fulfill their dharma
- ☐ Perform religious rituals in society

Kshatriyas

- ☐ Responsible for leadership of the people
- ☐ Often rely on advice from Brahmins
- Warriors and Kings




Vaisyas

- ☐ Skilled traders and merchants
- ☐ Shopkeepers who sell goods/merchandise
- ☐ These are the business owners in society



Sudras



- ☐ Unskilled workers who do manual labor
- ☐ Perform mostly services (farming, working in a shop, mining, factory worker, etc.)

Dalits (Untouchables)

- ☐ Expected to do the jobs in society associated with filth and disease
- ☐ Looked down upon by the other classes
- ☐ Considered impure, polluted (not as much Brahma in them)

 - Dharma is your DUTY or responsibility...this is what Brahma has decided your caste will do.
 - Examples of following your dharma include:
 - ☐ Marrying within your caste
 - ☐ Attending religious ceremonies and worshipping
 - □ Doing the job that is assigned with your caste

Effects of the Caste System

- ☐ Marriage only among member of same caste
- ☐ Job choices (and income) restricted/limited
- ☐ Discrimination (people are treated differently based on the caste they belong to)
- Educational opportunities
- □ Voting practices (vote for someone from your caste to support your views)
