Career and College Promise (CCP) is a dual enrollment program that gives North Carolina high school juniors and seniors the opportunity to get a "jump start" on college and earn college credit toward a two-year or four-year degree while still in high school.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for enrollment, a high school student must meet the following criteria:

- Be a high school junior or senior
- Have an unweighted high school GPA of 2.8 or greater or Benchmark test scores or have the recommendation of the high school principal or his/her designee

College Transfer Pathway ELIGIBILITY



Student must be a high school junior or senior

AND

Student must have an unweighted GPA of 2.8 or higher

OR

Student must demonstrate college readiness on approved assessment in English, Reading and Math



CTE Pathway Eligibility for Juniors and Seniors



Student must be a high school junior or senior

AND

Student must have an unweighted GPA of 2.8 or higher

OR

Student must demonstrate college readiness on approved assessment in English, Reading and Math

OR

Student receives recommendation from their high school CCP representative. Students under this option may not take UGETC classes even if they are on their CTE pathway.




CTE Pathway Eligibility for Freshmen and Sophomores

OR

- Must have the recommendation of the high school principal or his/her designee (assessment scores should be considered) and rationale for recommendation
- And have the recommendation of the college's Chief Academic Officer or Chief Student Development Administrator
- And passed Math I with a grade of C or better
- And scored a 3 or greater on the End of Course assessment (EOC) for Math I
- And scored a 3, 4, or 5 on the 8th grade End of Grade ELA assessment.

- **Must** have the recommendation of the high school principal or his/her designee (assessment scores should be considered) and rationale for recommendation
- And have the recommendation of the college's Chief Academic Officer or Chief Student Development Administrator
- And demonstrate college readiness in English, reading and mathematics on an assessment (See Benchmark Scores).




IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR FRESHMEN AND SOPHOMORES

Freshmen and Sophomores are limited to CTE pathways in agriculture and natural resources (15xxx), business technologies (25xxx), construction technologies (35xxx), engineering technologies (40xxx), industrial technologies (50xxx), and transportation (60xxx) certificate and diploma programs without UGETC courses.

Some schools may not yet be participating with this new option. Please speak with your CDC to see if this is possible at your school.







- Attend an Information Session
- Complete the CCP application*
- Log into your CFNC account and request that a transcript from your high school be sent to CPCC
- MANDATORY meeting with your school's Career Development Coordinator (CDC) CMS and Certain Charter Schools ONLY
- Create CPCC Login
- Activate your CPCC email address
- Take a placement test (if needed)
- Gather needed paperwork and submit NON-CMS Schools
- Reconnect with your CDC for processing CMS and Certain Charter Schools ONLY
- Register for classes (Students taking online classes must complete a blackboard tutorial and pass a quiz)
- · Check and Pay college fees (required before the first day of class) For CMS Summer semester ONLY
- New Student complete MANDATORY CCP Checkpoint
- Pick up your CPCC ID and parking permit
- Buy/Rent your books (CMS date for book purchase will be emailed each semester, but is typically ~ 2 weeks before first day of class)

^{*} Your social security number is requested on the CCP application. This is not mandatory, but is needed if you want to receive a 1098 T tax form.

- Sign in
- Select apply
- Select apply to college
- Select application hub
- Select request a transcript
- Complete the fields accurately and choose Central Piedmont Community College as the receiver




Summer and Fall 2020 CCP Processing Schedule


Student Submission Date	Processing Information
Students submitted between February 28 and April 10	Will be processed to register on April 27, 2020* (First day registration available for all new and returning students)
Students submitted between April 11 and April 17	Will be processed to register on May 4, 2020*
Students submitted between April 18 and April 24	Will be able to register on May 11, 2020*
Students submitted after April 24 th will be processed in the order they are received, which may be after May 11 th . Submissions after May 11 th will be processed within 7 business days.	The deadline for Summer 2020 is May 6 th . The deadline for Fall 2020 full semester is July 27, 2020. The deadline for Fall 2 nd short session is September 30, 2020.

Please note that high schools have their own internal deadlines that students must adhere to.

CCP Checkpoint MANDATORY

CCP Checkpoint is an orientation and is MANDATORY for new CCP students or students who have never completed CCP Checkpoint. If you are a returning student and have already completed this, there is no need to attend. If you are a new student, it is mandatory that you complete Checkpoint and pass a quiz at the end. We are hosting sessions via WebEX.

Advising Workshops
