# Reminders for Start of School

- School starts on Monday, August 29, 2016. Students should arrive by 8:40 am to make the first bell of the day that signals students to move to their first class. On Monday and Tuesday, students will report to their Advisories (or homerooms) first. Lists will be in the hall.
- Freshman Orientation will be on Tuesday August 23rd for ALL new NINTH grade students from 9:00—11:30. Students will meet in the gym. Parents may choose to drop students off as the Freshman Orientation activities are student only. Parents also may choose to drop in to the media center between 9 and 10 to meet our PTSO parents and some staff for coffee and pastries. PTSO parents and staff will be available to answer questions and discuss both the high school and academy studies with you. Other information for parents is contained in this electronic newsletter sent to the email address we have on file for you.
- New Sophomore (10th graders) Orientation will be on Tuesday August 23rd from 12:30—2:00. Please meet in room 401—or what we call "the fishbowl". Parents are welcome to drop in to the media center between 12:30-1:30 to ask questions about school procedures, or feel free to just drop your student off.
- All current 10th—12th graders' Orientations—Monday 8/22. Seniors 8-10, Juniors 10-12, Sophomores 1-3. Get schedules, lockers, bus information, spiritwear, and parking passes. Lockers can be rented for \$3 per year.
- Athletic Home Games this year—Soccer game 8/25, Tennis 8/16 at Dickerson, Volleyball 8/16, Football 8/26, XCountry 9/6. See the Athletics page for more information. Come out and support the Cougars!!!
- Parent email and phone contact information—it is vital that we have accurate information so that we can reach you concerning your students. You will receive a form for changes with the student's back to school paperwork. You may also email <a href="Mr. William Smith">Mr. William Smith</a> with any changes.
- Chromebooks for ALL students at CATA—Parents—both you and your child will be required to sign a Chrome book Student /Parent Agreement. EVERY student will receive a

form on the first day of school. The form will be due back the next morning. Students will not be able to receive a chrome book when they are distributed unless the form is signed. The technology user fee (which carries INSURANCE again this year!!) for your student is due by September 5th—you can pay now ONLINE by going to our main CATA website.

- Parking Passes will be sold on 8/22 during open house—see information inside—important!!!!
- Performing Arts Academy will be having a welcome back potluck dinner on Tuesday 8/23 for all families (grades 9-12).

#### **Student Parking Passes**

**Seniors Only** – Parking passes will be on sale on Monday 8/22 on a first come first served basis from 8:00—10:00. ONLY Seniors that buy on this day are guaranteed spots.

All students – Juniors will be able to buy their passes from 10:00—12:00, and Sophomores will be able to purchase from 1:00—3:00.

- ALL past due student fees must be paid before you are permitted to purchase a parking pass—this includes the 2013-2014, 2015-2016, AND 2016-2017 technology fee, media center fees, cafeteria, etc..
- ALL Students, MUST print and bring ALL required documents with you along with the cash (exact amount) or check for \$40 made payable to Central Academy of Technology & Arts. Any incomplete application packets will delay the process and you canNOT reserve your parking spot until all documents and check are turned in. Please make sure to have your parent sign the registration forms. They are available on the CATA website under "Students".
- <u>Students may choose their parking spot number if they purchase BEFORE the first day of school</u>. After that we will sell remaining spots in order.
- If you pay with cash, you MUST have exact change.

STUDENTS WHO DRIVE TO SCHOOL ON THE FIRST DAY WILL NEED TO HAVE A HANG TAG TO PARK IN A RESERVED SPACE. The availability of reserved parking spots is not guaranteed as we have limited spaces. While seniors that purchase on the first day are guaranteed spots, other spots are only available if spaces remain. Students obtaining their license during the school year are not guaranteed a spot, and may have to wait until the following year to drive. We will have a waitlist for those students bringing in all appropriate documentation.

#### Can't come to Open House??

No Worries. You can accomplish all of the tasks on the first day of school as well. We do recommend that if you will be driving to school on the first day that you buy your parking pass BEFORE that day so that you can choose your spot. Parking passes issued after school start will be chosen according to the next open spot.

Any schedules/bus information NOT picked up at open house will be mailed home Wednesday afternoon.

Schedules—Please also note that schedules can be viewed on the Parent Portal as well. Schedules will be considered valid **as of August 22nd**. Schedules viewed prior to that are not final schedules and should be ignored until the 8/22 release date. If we can finalize them earlier we will make an announcement.

If there are staffing changes or other school changes, schedules may be changed at any point.

- Please do NOT send in any schedule change requests based on schedules viewed prior to 8/22 on Parent Portal.
- ALL schedule requests will be submitted using the Schedule Change form available in guidance OR by emailing your counselor. If schedules are available prior to this date, you will be notified with a connect-ed communication.
- So that counselors can have ample time to meet the needs of all students requesting changes, there will not be any meetings with counselors to discuss schedule changes. If there is a need for a discussion the counselor will contact you via email or phone. Please be sure to provide information on the online form where you can be reached.
- All current students met with their counselors last spring to choose courses and information was sent home to parents as well. Schedule changes will only be approved if:
  - There is a hole in your schedule (fewer than 8 classes)
  - There is a class listed twice
  - There is a class listed which you have already passed
  - There is a class listed for which you have not passed the pre-requisite

**AP Level Classes:** It is quite typical for Fall AP classes to have summer reading or review activities for students. Please check the CATA website for information. Some teachers send an email to students, so students should check their UCPS student email as well (some teachers did this in the spring before school was out).

Students in AP level courses should expect to take a rigorous AP-level final exam with their AP teacher prior to taking the actual AP exam. This AP level exam will count for 25% of their final grade in the AP course. This will ensure that they are preparing well enough to pass these college-level courses and exams. Teachers will discuss this more with your student at the start of each course. It is important that you and your student remember that an AP course should be a college-level course, and as such, have college-level assessments.

# Attention Seniors - Thursday September 1st, 6:30 pm in

the CATA Auditorium the **Guidance Department will be hosting Senior Night**. This event is for all seniors and their parents. The purpose of CATA Senior Night is to review a packet of information that explains and guides the timeline of senior year. Seniors will also receive a copy of their unofficial transcript to use for college applications. Beginning the week of September 5th to the end of September each guidance counselor will have an individual meeting with each



of their assigned seniors—please note that seniors will receive important information that they need to have BEFORE they meet with their counselor. Your attendance at the evening meeting is strongly encouraged. Please contact your assigned counselor is you have any questions.

#### **CATA Guidance Department**

A high school guidance department can help your student with a LOT during high school—counseling during a problem/or stress, college planning, career/college questions, interview skills, problem solving with classes/teachers, friendship/social issues. Counselors also help with scheduling and what courses to take. Counselors are available to answer parent questions as well.



#### **CHROMEBOOKS- 2016-2017**

CATA is the school of Technology and all students are required to use their chromebooks at school. UCPS Technology Initiative provides learning anywhere, anytime for our students. We are very excited for all of our CATA students to receive their Chromebook again to use for schoolwork during the school year. This is an amazing initiative that students in UCPS will again benefit from. Students at CATA are required to bring their chrome book to school every day.

**Parents**—both you and your child will be required to sign a Chrome book Student /Parent Agreement. **EVERY student will receive a form on the first day of school.** The form will be due back the next morning (Tuesday 8/30). Students will not be able to receive a chrome book on Tuesday 8/30 unless the form is signed.

The required technology user fee (\$25) for your student is due by September 5th. This fee includes an insurance policy that covers accidental damage. It is important to pay your fee so that if there is accidental damage to your child's computer that it is covered. You can pay this fee online.

#### SAT Prep Course with Future Prep @ CATA:

CATA will once again be offering an SAT prep course through Future Prep right here at CATA! Students will review content on all three areas of the NEW SAT with a special focus on the essay. Students will also learn global and section-specific strategies that will help maximize their test day performance. As part of this prep course, students will take a full-length practice test halfway through. In preparation for the *November 5th SAT*, this prep course will be held on Thursdays from 4:00 to 6:30 p.m. beginning September 29, 2016 and ending November 3, 2016. The practice test will be held on Saturday, October 15, 2016 from 8:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. The cost for the entire course is \$179. # **New Family Information**

- School day hours: 8:50-3:30 (Class starts at 8:50, students should all **arrive by 8:40** when the first bell rings to move to class.) If you are dropping your student off by car, you should arrive between 8:20—8:30 to ensure that your child can get to class on time.
- Lunches are determined by your 3rd block teacher. Don't worry—you will meet people to sit with.
- Upon arrival on the first day of school, all students will report to Advisory first. Advisory assignments will be posted at the front of the school.
- Set uniforms are not required for PE classes, but a dress code is strictly enforced. This will be discussed during the first day of class. Sneakers, athletic shorts, and t-shirt are required every day.
- Lockers are not required, but you may rent a locker for \$3.00. PE Lockers are required. Your PE teacher
  will provide information on rental fee. NO students may leave their belongings out in the PE locker room—
  ALL belongings must be secured with a school-issued lock.
- There is not a supply list. Supplies needed are on a class by class basis and each teacher will communicate this on the first day of school. Just bring something to write ON and something to write WITH.
- Attendance is taken during each class, and it is vital that you are present at school every day for every class. If you must make doctor appointments during the school day, be sure to do so at different times of the day so you don't miss too many days in one class.
- Attendance matters for participation in extracurricular activities, credit for courses, and affects eligibility for sports. Students too sick to come to school should not be on school grounds for extracurricular events that day. Absence notes MUST be turned in within three days.
- Every teacher will have a web page (on Canvas) for students and parents to access with course information.
- All students will receive a student login/password to the Parent Portal so that they can see their grades.
- Students are expected to check their school email account as both teachers and administration use this to communicate with students.
