JOINTLY DEVELOPED

<u>Caledonia Elementary School</u> will take the following actions to involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely manner in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs, including opportunities for regular meetings, if requested by parents, to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their child.

CES will share with parents the budget for parent and family engagement activities during the spring planning meetings in the spring in order to gain information from parents regarding how they feel the money should be spent. Parent feedback is obtained through meeting evaluations, suggestions and comments presented in meetings that are documented on meeting minutes, questionnaires, and parent surveys.

The designation of a parent coordinator on the CES campus is a way to help coordinate parent and family engagement programs. The parent coordinator serves as a liaison between the school and the parent. The parent coordinator helps to organize regular parent meetings and other programs and events where parents are invited to come out and meet with teachers and administrators concerning their child's progress in school. These meetings are set aside as a time to build and help maintain parent relationships with the school and the teachers. Workshops provided by the parent coordinator throughout the year will be designed to provide parents with information that will aid them in continuing the learning process at home with their child.

The parent coordinator and the Parent Teacher Organization work together to reach as many parents as possible. They offer multiple ways to get involved with school activities. CES has planned to meet with parents during Parent Teacher Conference Day do discuss PAPER tutoring, Title 1, and resources parents can help their child with at home. The parent coordinator also plans to invite community leaders into the school during Dr. Seuss week to read books to the children, and a reading night for Read Across America Week to promote literacy. The parent coordinator is planning a MAAP celebration night to honor students in 4th and 5th grade who showed growth or proficiency on state test. In the past, CES has hosted a Family summer challenge night for the Spring to help keep students engaged in learning throughout the summer. Parents are also invited to eat lunch with their children or volunteer in classrooms.

BUILDING CAPACITY OF PARENTS

<u>Caledonia Elementary School</u> will build the parents' capacity for strong parent and family engagement to ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school and the community to improve student academic achievement through the following:

- Providing parents with a description and explanation of the curriculum in use at the school, the forms of academic assessments used to measure student progress, and the achievement levels of the challenging State academic standards.
- Materials and training to help parents to work with their child to improve their child's achievement, such as literacy training and using technology (including education about the harms of copyright piracy), as appropriate, to foster parent and family engagement.
- Providing assistance to parents of participating children, as appropriate, in understanding topics such as the following:

CES will provide parents with a description and explanation of the curriculum in use through the school website, the school brochure, parent-teacher conferences, parent meetings including the Annual Title I parent meeting and the spring planning meetings.

The school provided parents with individual student academic assessment results at the beginning of the year. Teachers will discuss the child's score report with the parents to inform them of the child's performance level, domain performance, and strategies to ensure student growth and learning at Parent-teacher conference day. The EL tutor will work with the teachers to help provide this information to any EL parent or a parent in need of translation assistance.

The school will provide parents with a description and explanation of the assessments used to measure student progress through the quarterly Title I newsletters, letters and parent reports sent home regarding specific assessments, teachers' weekly newsletters, and during parent meetings including the Annual Title I parent meeting and spring planning meetings.

The school will provide training opportunities for parents regarding how to help their child's performance on state assessments through workshops, parent meetings, the school's website, and the Title I quarterly newsletters. Parents may contact the Parent Coordinator at any time to assist in technology, curriculum, or any other question that might arise throughout the year.

BUILDING CAPACITY OF SCHOOL STAFF

<u>Caledonia Elementary</u> will provide training to educate teachers, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other school leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the school by:

The school will provide training opportunities for teachers through professional development sessions and focus faculty meetings regularly throughout the school year. The academic coach will work with teachers to promote best practices strategies in the classroom to improve student success. The school will disseminate information to teachers at the beginning of the year faculty meeting regarding procedures for EL students, homeless and migrant students, and the importance and means available for parent communications. Teachers will communicate regularly with parents using various means including: Remind 101, Schoology, AIM 3.0, weekly newsletters, student planners, text messages, email, phone calls, and parent notes. Teachers are encouraged to provide opportunities for parent volunteers in the classrooms in order to work with parents as equal partners in the education of students. CES will provide opportunities for each grade-level and classroom to engage in programs where parents are included to promote ties between home and school. Teachers are informed at the beginning of the year faculty meeting on how to initiate communication with parents in a way that they can understand and is meaningful to them.
