






Supreme Court ruled against the Scotts because:

- 1. African Americans were not citizens and had no rights under the Constitution.
- 2. They, being slaves, were considered property that could not be taken away from their owners.

- 1 Emancipation Proclamation (Jan 1, 1863)
- 2 Southern states secede (Dec 1860 June 1861)
- 3 MN becomes a state (May 11,1858)
- 4 1st MN regiment in Battle of Bull Run (July 21, 1861)
- 5 Lincoln elected president (Nov 6, 1860)
- 6 Abraham Lincoln assassinated (Apr 15, 1865)
- 7 Civil War ended (Apr 9, 1865)
- 8 Dred Scott decision (1857)
- 9 1st MN regiment in Battle of Gettysburg (July 1-3, 1863)
- 10 1st MN volunteer regiment sent to Washington DC (June 22, 1861)
- 11 Battle of Antietam (Sept 17, 1862)
