- 1. What were the most important signs of nationalism that developed in the period 1815-1824?
- 2. How did the existence of a vast western frontier shape Americans' values and society in the period 1815-1840?
- 3. How did the forces of nationalism compete with sectional interests in the economic and judicial struggles of the period?
- 4. How did American nationalism display itself in foreign policy, particularly in the acquisition of Florida and in American policy toward Europe and the Western Hemisphere?
- 5. In what ways did the <u>transportation revolution</u> contribute to the development of a national <u>market economy</u> in the United States between 1810 and 1840?
- 6. How did the new transportation systems create a commercially linked national economy and a specialized sectional division of labor?
- 7. What were the effects of the new factory system of production on early industrial workers, and how did they respond to these conditions? (pg. 266-270 in Ch. 9 AND pg. 288 in Ch. 10) What was the impact of the new economic developments on the role of women in society?
- 8. What role did the West play in crucial issues of the period as the tariff, internal improvements, and the expansion of slavery?
- 9. Why did the issue of admitting Missouri to the Union precipitate a major national crisis? Why did the North and South each agree to the terms of the Missouri Compromise?
- 10. Describe the evolution of American policies and actions toward Native Americans between 1816 and 1830. Could the trans-Appalachian interior have been settled in any other fashion by American settlers? Why or why not?
- 11. Discuss how the major decisions of the Supreme Court under John Marshall's leadership enhanced the growth of nationalism and a strong federal government. Include examples of specific court cases from the period.
- 12. The period 1816-1824 is referred to as the Era of Good Feelings. Is this an accurate portrayal? Why or why not?
