

Immunizations Required for 7th Graders in 2017/18

Sixth grade parents: Your child is required by state law to have **BOTH** a meningococcal and a Tdap immunization before the start of 7th grade next school year. Through the aid of an online state immunization registry, I was able to obtain these records already for about half of the class. If we do NOT have your child's immunization record, you will receive periodic reminder phone calls and emails from us. If you receive these messages, that means you need to provide us with immunization records from your child's physician. We are accepting these immunizations records now. 
