Regime types

- Single-Party System
- Democratic Centralism
- Ran under the Communist Party of China
- Highest source of power is the Politburo Standing Committee, absolute power.

Type of economic system

- Socialist Market Economy
 - Allowed privatized business
 - Os Does not register information about the private sector.
 - Privatized health care and education.
 - Branched off from China's centrally planned economy.
 - "Socialism with Chinese characteristics."

Governance and Accountability

- National Congress of the Communist Party of China
 - Brings together all of the sectors of the communist party together every 5 years. It's original purpose was to be the most powerful decision making system in the Party.
- Central Discipline Inspection Committee
 - In charge of "rooting out corruption" and reviewing the sectors of the Communist Party. On equal level with the Central Committee
- Central Committee
 - Politburo Standing Committee (the actual most powerful branch)
 - Politburo
 - The Secretariat Administer
 - Central Military Commission
