1. RECREATE A PHOTO

Look for a photograph of you when you were younger which you would like to recreate. Analyze the original photo for composition and lighting and re-create the photo as closely as you can. Include the original photo in your post.

2. YOUR FAVORITE TEACHER

Take a nice portrait of your favorite teacher. Edit and post your best portrait and write a paragraph reflection explaining why you like and admire this teacher. Give details, reasons, and examples as to why you chose this teacher.

3. POETRY AND PHOTOGRAPHY

Take a new photo for this assignment or use one of your existing edited photos.

1. Make a new document 11×14 or 14×11 @ 300 res
2. Move your photo into your new document and size to fit.
3. Add a quote, poetry, song lyrics or your own words to your edited image.

4. ALBUM COVER FOR A MUSICAL ARTIST

Work with a musical artist you know to produce an album cover design. Make sure the cover has a strong photograph and text to include the artist's name and the name of the record. Make sure you make the album cover 12×12. Do not use another artist's image to create this.

5. HIGH CONTRAST

Research the work of Aaron Siskind, an American photographer who shot abstract black and white images, which focus on nature, architecture and human form. Take some photos on the MONOCHROME setting, in the style of Aaron Siskind, edit them with good density and contrast, and post 2-3 black and white images on your blog with the technical information in the caption of each photo. Under your photo, post a photo by Aaron Siskind and write three complete sentences describing his work and your opinion of his work.

6. CANDIDS AND CAPTIONS

Photograph 5 candid moments and edit your images using an app/program of your choice. In the caption section of each photo you post, write a caption including who, what, where and why.

7. SELF- PORTRAIT

Take a photograph which represents something important about yourself, without showing your face in the photograph. In the caption section when you post, write a paragraph reflection explaining how this photograph conceptually and visually shows something about you and what you are attempting to share about yourself with the viewer.

8. TED TALK

Watch this Tedtalk on how photography connects us and on your blog make a post summarizing, critiquing, judging and evaluating what you got out of watching the video. Have at least 3 paragraphs.

9. 100 MOST INFLUENTIAL PHOTOS OF ALL TIME

Read this link and on your blog pick 3 of the most influential photos to write about. Include the story behind the photo and what intrigues you about it. Make sure to post the three photos with your writing.

10. NATURAL LIGHT PORTRAITS

- Take at least 5 portraits of a classmate on location using natural light.
- Think about exposure, lighting, composition, posing and expression.
- Edit your photos using any preferred editing application and post all 5 EDITED photos of your subject.

11. FOOD PHOTOS

- Go online (Pinterest is a great tool) and look at good samples of food photography. Read this online article on how to photograph food (and research some other tips online) and write 10 complete sentences on your blog on what you learned. <http://digital-photography-school.com/top-5-tips-on-how-to-photograph-food/>
- Next, pretend you are a studio food photographer and photograph food. Take a few photos with varying compositions and post your favorite 3-5 edited photos to your blog.

12. BODY, SHAPE, FORM

Photograph a part of the body, or something, which shows shape and form. Think about getting great QUALITY OF LIGHT and make your composition a strong one. In the caption section of your image write 10 words to describe your final image.

13. SPORTS PHOTO CRITIQUE

Look online for photographs from any significant sporting event that has taken place in the last year – locally, nationally, or internationally. Find at least three photos, which you think are absolutely amazing. Post them to your blog and explain under each photo how you think the photographer shot the image technically. Also talk about the composition and why the image is so successful.

14. SNAP BACK IN TIME

Either go for a drive or walk to discover all that is historical around us here in our beautiful province. It may be an old school, house, grain bin, or barn – just look around – you'll be guaranteed to find something with tons of character. Using your phone camera, capture its beauty in its truest form. When editing, focus on sharpening, contrast, and saturation to ensure the structure pops.

15. LAND OF LIVING SKIES

Landscape photography is one of the most popular types of photography. Being that we live in the "land of living skies" your task is to capture one of our impressive sunset scenes. Capture as much detail, vibrancy, and contrast as possible to achieve a compelling photograph.

16. PETOGRAPHY

Pet photography is all the rage. People love their pets more than ever as they're part of nearly everyone's family. Whether it be your/a dog, cat, fish, horse, cow, or goat, capture the pet in his/her truest form. This may be eating, sleeping, playing, snuggling, bathing, etc. Work at trying to capture their love and affection for life.

17. YOUR FAVOURITE PERSON

We all have a favorite person in our world – whether it be your parents, siblings, aunts and uncles, grandmas and grandpas, cousins, friends, significant others, neighbors, coach, etc. Capture this person in their element doing what they love.

18. LETTER TO NEXT YEAR'S PHOTO STUDENTS

Write a three paragraph letter to next year's photo students. Talk about what you liked and did not like about the class, projects and workload, and any other pieces of advice you give to future Photography students here at Greenall.

19. SHAPE COLLAGE

Abstract artists typically use shape to help form unique pieces of art. Using photos, you will create a collage using a variety of shapes. Using an app of your choice, use at least 10 different photos of shapes to create your collage.

20. CREATE AN AD

Put yourself in the shoes of an influencer, and develop an ad for a product of your choice. Take a set of 3 photos advertising the product in various compositions to showcase it to consumers.

21. HIGHSCHOOL LIFE

High school is a short part of of your life. The best way to remember it? Picture it! Your job is to capture a day in the life of a high school student with 5-10 photos that represent your life in high school. Your friends, classes, extra curricular, job, hobbies, interests, etc. can help you represent this project.

22. VISION BOARD

Using stock or images you have taken, you are to create a vision board of what you want your life to look like in 10 years from today. You will need a minimum of 15 images to help represent your goals. You can create this board using Canva or an app of your choosing.

23. INTERIOR SHOTS

Real estate agents, construction companies, interior designers, engineers, and many more professions utilize photography to showcase their work on projects they have completed. For this task, you will take 5 photos of a home's interior to showcase it's design, construction, decor, etc.
