Choice Program

CHOICE PROGRAM Logan Township School District has one open student seat in 6th, 7th or 8th grade for the 2025-2026. The district believes that this will be beneficial to the fortunate student who applies and get accepted, due to Logan's unique small learning environment. Logan Township School District operates a middle school of approximately 300 students with a wide range of opportunities while still maintaining small class size. This small school learning environment allows the middle school child to find "their niche" which does not always occur for an adolescent in a larger learning environment. Logan's teachers know all students; the school counselor works as a team with the middle school principal to provide academic and educational support; an I &RS (Intervention and Referral Service) Team meets regularly to review data and suggest interventions and the district administrators work as a cohesive unit to maximize the many resources this proud district has available for its students. The Middle School programs which will be provided to choice students include but are not limited to:

- A one-to-one Chrome Book initiative
- An interactive white board in each middle school classroom
- STEM education (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) for all students
- A choice of two World Languages, Italian or Spanish in grade 8
- Pre-Algebra and Algebra I to students who meet criteria Performing Arts including Band, Choir and Drama, and the Middle School Annual Musical
- Gifted and Talented program to students who meet criteria
- Positive Behavior Support Initiative
- Afterschool Clubs

Choice Seats Availability

The purpose of the chart below is to inform parents of choice seat availability **before** the application deadline on November 25, 2024. After the deadline, the information will be outdated.

The Department of Education limits the number of choice seats that each district can fill. The "maximum number of new choice students that can be enrolled" tells parents how many *new* choice students the district can enroll in the next school year. If more than the maximum number of applications is received, a lottery will be held and a waitlist will be developed. Waitlists will be developed for all approved choice grades even if no seats are currently available. NA indicates the district is not accepting choice applications for those grades.

The district gives enrollment preference to choice applicants who have a sibling currently enrolled in the choice district and who will continue to be enrolled in the following year, provided the applicant will enroll in a choice-approved grade/program, they meet any program-specific criteria, and the district has seats available in the desired grades. Transportation Note to Parents

Transportation of choice students is not guaranteed. If a student is eligible for transportation (within 20 miles of the school) and the cost will exceed the maximum amount designated in the Annual Appropriations Act, the parent/guardian will be given aid in lieu of transportation and, in some cases, the option of receiving the transportation and paying the additional amount over the maximum. By Aug. 1, parents should receive

notification of their transportation options from the resident district. For more information, read the *Choice School Transportation Procedures* found on the Student Transportation webpage.

Tier 1 students

Choice districts must first fill their available seats with Tier 1 students. If the number of Tier 1 applications exceeds the number of choice seats available, the choice district must hold a lottery to randomly select students.

Tier 1 students include the following applicants:

- Students who are enrolled in a NJ public school in their resident school district during the time of application and for the entire year immediately preceding enrollment in a choice district.
- A student who moved during the school year and attended their resident district schools.
- Students who attend a choice district that terminates before 12th grade and have reached the final grade.
- Charter school students.
- To qualify as Tier 1 for kindergarten, a student must be attending their resident district preschool, or
 a student has a sibling attending the choice district in the current year and the sibling will continue to
 be enrolled in the following year.

Tier 2 students

Choice districts are not obligated to accept Tier 2 students. If a choice district accepts Tier 2 applicants, they may do so after all the qualified Tier 1 applicants have been accepted. If the number of Tier 2 applications exceeds the number of choice seats available, the choice district must hold a Tier 2 lottery to select students. Tier 2 students include NJ residents who have **not** attended their resident public school for the entire year immediately prior to enrollment in the desired choice district and do **not** otherwise meet the requirements for Tier 1. This includes students who have been attending public school outside their districts of residence or private school. Tier 2 students also include students applying for kindergarten who are **not** attending their resident district preschool and do not have a sibling attending the choice district in the current year.
