### **Attendance**

It is important that you are in class. The learning that occurs in many of the lectures and discussions cannot be duplicated in readings. If you happen to miss a day of class, it is your responsibility to find out what you missed. You are responsible for all information presented in this class. The district attendance policy, as described in the Student Handbook, may affect a grade.

#### **Tardy Policy**

### **Grading Policy**

It is my belief that every student can be successful in this course if they apply themselves and take advantage of the opportunities presented to them. This includes studying, reading the text, and participating in class. I am always available for additional help so that every student can achieve his or her full potential.

An I/F indicates that the student has missing work or has not attained 60% of his/her points. A student has 2 weeks to complete the work for a passing grade, to be determined by the teacher. Remember, this course is required for graduation! Failure to pass either term will lead to repetition of that term. Grades will be updated on AH Connect approximately every two weeks in order to monitor student progress.

#### Grading of work for this course includes:

- Late work will be awarded at 50% of the earned grade. Exceptions can be made in the case of major projections considering the students circumstances (i.e. a sliding scale per day it is late).
- 2. In addition to reading a book of their choice and subsequent report, students will complete an issue paper and participate in a political campaign during the first term. Other projects may be added.
- 3. Quizzes may be given during each unit to help you prepare for the unit test.
- 4. A major component in this course is Youth Service/Civic Participation. It will be an expectation that all students complete this. The grade for this is 5% of the student's grade. Details will follow.
- 5. A district assessment test will be given at the end of the trimester and will count as a percentage of the final grade.
