Long Term Graduation Requirements Class of 2023 & Beyond

First, cover the basics: Course Completion: Students will satisfy Ohio's curriculum requirements and any additional local requirements. Students will complete the required 21 units, with specific units required in each content area.

English Language Arts	4 credits
Math (including Algebra 2 or its equivalent)	4 credits
Science (must include physical science and life science)	3 credits
Social Studies (must include US History, Government, & World History)	3 credits
Health	½ credit
Physical Education	½ credit
Introduction to Business & Technology	1 credit
Electives to complete 21 credits	5 credits

Second, show competency: Students must demonstrate competency in math and English by passing the state's Algebra I and English II tests. Students who have taken required tests more than once without passing and have received remedial support are able to show competency through one of the options below:
