One Academy, Two Teams

As a 9th grader, students will be assigned to one of two teams:

Alpha

OR

Omega

*Students do not need to (and are not able to) request a team during registration. Registering for certain classes will not make it more likely for them to be in one team over the other. Their team will be randomly assigned to them.

Being on a team, allows students to:

- Have a home base in the high school
- Get to know the same teachers
- Get to know the same students
- Reduce how far or often they need to travel to other areas of the high school

Block Schedule

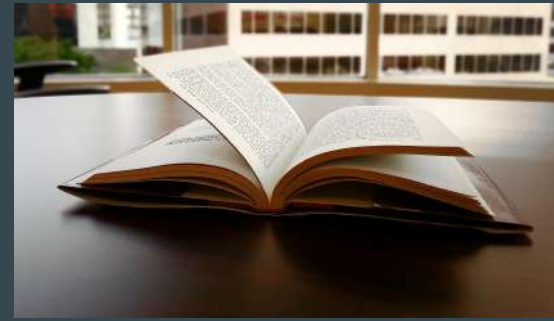

English



★ Graduation Requirement: 8 credits

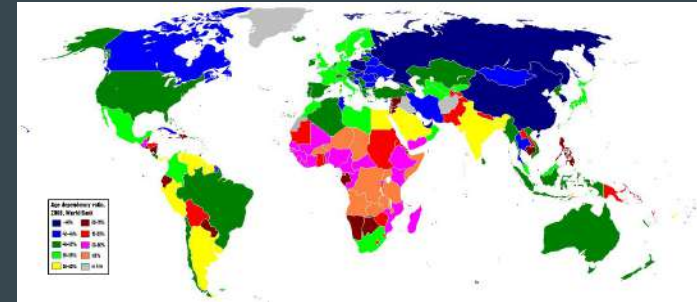
Classes: English 9 OR Accelerated English 9

English (2 quarters, 2 credits)

Accelerated English 9 (2 quarters, 3 credits)

- Curriculum includes 9th and 10th grade English standards
- Students who are currently in an accelerated track will automatically be placed into accelerated classes in that track (unless they select out)
- Standardized test scores and current grades will be reviewed to invite newly qualified students in the Spring

Social Studies - Human Geography



★ Graduation Requirement: 8 credits

Classes: Human Geography OR AP Human Geography

Human Geography (2 quarters, 2 credits)

AP Human Geography (2 quarters, 2 credits)

- AP Human Geography is open to any student willing to take on the challenge of an AP course
- AP (Advanced Placement): College level course, offered with opportunity to earn college credit by passing an exam in the Spring (must score 3 or higher). AP is a weighted GPA course.

Science - Physics



★ Graduation Requirement: 6 credits

Classes: Physics OR AP Physics I

Physics - (2 quarters, 2 credits)

AP Physics I - (3 quarters, 3 credits)

- AP (Advanced Placement): College level course, offered with opportunity to earn college credit by passing an exam in the Spring (must score 3 or higher). AP is a weighted GPA course.
- *Only students taking Accelerated Algebra 2 or higher math can take AP Physics

Math



★ Graduation Requirement: 6 credits

Based on the math course students are currently in, and their standardized test scores, they will select one of the following:

- Algebra
 - If student did not pass or did not take algebra in 8th grade. This course does not count as a required HS math credit. This would count for 'elective' credit.
- Geometry - typical 9th grade course
- Algebra 2 or Acc. Algebra 2 - accelerated 9th grade courses
 - Student must complete Geometry prior to moving on to Acc. Algebra 2

Freshman Seminar

★ Graduation Requirement: 1 credit



★ A class for 9th graders to build academic skills, connect with the Shakopee High School Community, and examine how future goals connect to current academic choices

★ All 9th graders will take a Freshman Seminar course that will meet every other day for the first two quarters (1 credit)

- Freshman Seminar will alternate with another class
- The class it alternates with will be determined after registration by administration

Physical Education & Health



- ★ **Graduation Requirement: 2 PE credits/1 Health credit**
 - Must take an introductory physical education in 9th grade:
 - Fit for Life
 - Intro to Sport Performance
 - An additional physical education credit will be taken between 10-12th grade
 - Advanced Fit for Life
 - Advanced Sport Performance
 - Must take Healthy Lifestyles between 10-12th grade

Fine Arts



★ Graduation Requirement: 2 credits

Financial Literacy

- ★ What it is: this class will cover personal money management, savings, and investment strategies
- ★ This class will be offered starting in the fall of 2020!
- ★ This class will be required for classes 2022 and beyond


Program of Study

- ★ What it is: a 3-course sequence that is focused on a student's career area of interest
- ★ Class of 2022 & beyond will be required to complete at least one Program of Study in their Academy
- ★ Upon completion of a Program of Study, our hope is that students will be able to say,

“No, I’ve given this career area a try and I don’t need to continue down this path.”

“Yes, this career area is interesting and I would like to continue to learn more”

- Spanish for Spanish Speakers (SSS): talk with your Spanish teacher for placement recommendations!



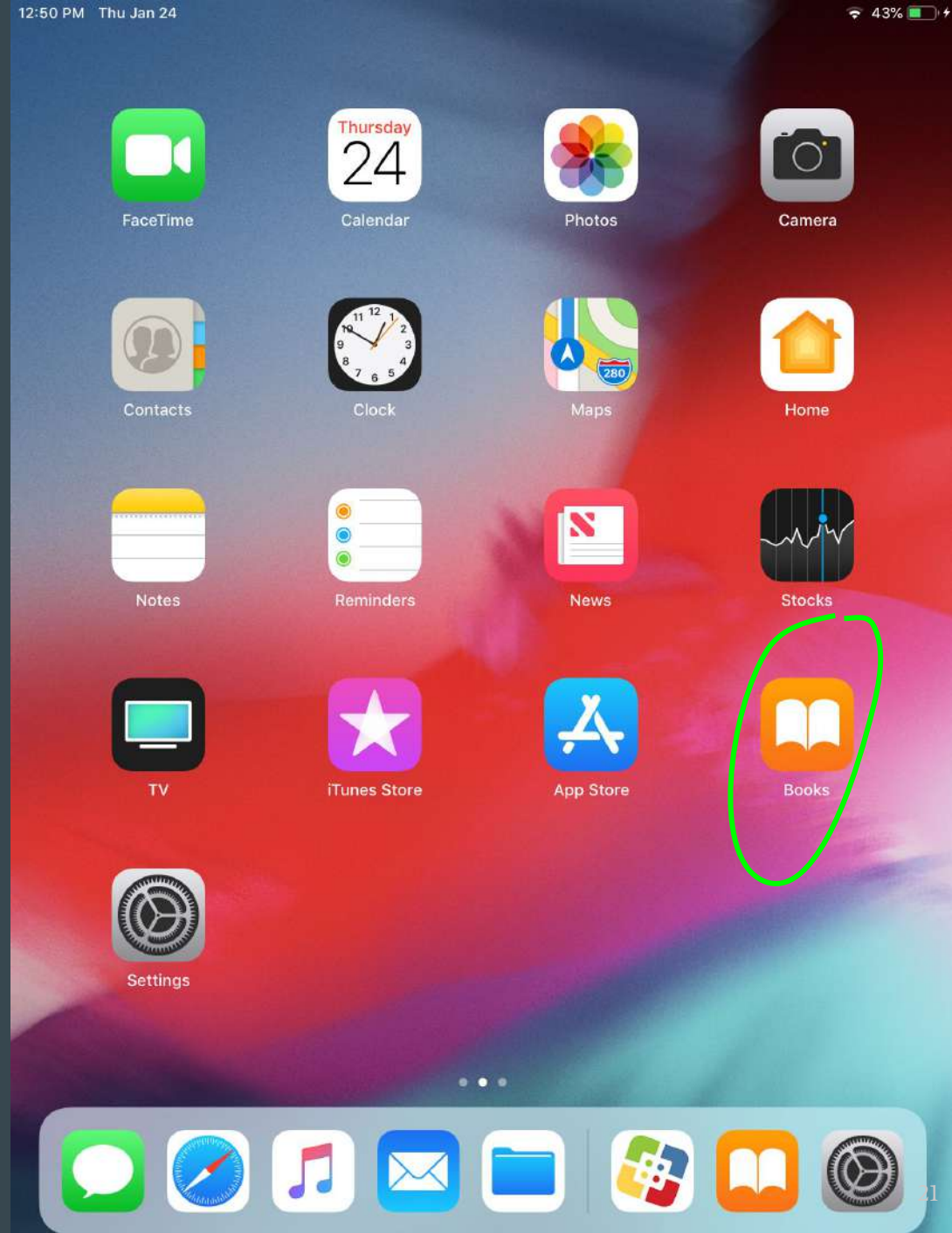

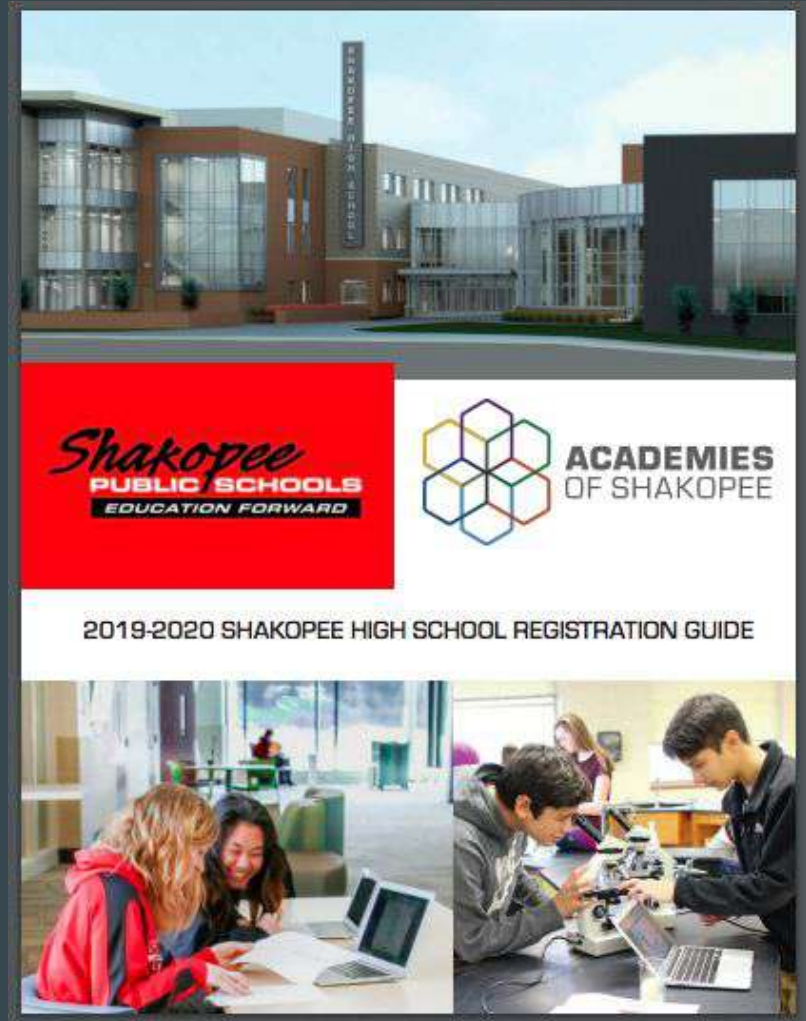

Understanding their Registration Guide

Interior Design 

Grade Level: 9,10,11,12
Credits: SHS: 1 Credit
Prerequisite: None
Program of Study: Arts & Communication - Elective

Description: When you walk into a room, do you imagine a new design? Do you want to re-create the space in your own way? In Interior Design I, you will learn the basics of designing spaces for the interior and exterior of homes. This course will emphasize designing and drawing floor plans, types of furniture and furniture layout, window treatments, wall coverings, the history of housing, and the elements and principles of design. These skills will guide students to creatively and knowledgeably design rooms. Students will create floor plans and presentation boards that reflect their creativity as an interior designer.

AP Studio Art – A & B  

Grade Level: 11,12
Credits: SHS: 2 Credits
College: Possible college credit with a score of 4 or higher on a portfolio of work submitted to the College Board.
Prerequisite: Advanced Art Studio (must register in same academic year) This is an independent study course.
Description: This class is designed for students who are seriously interested in the practical experience of art and want to focus on medium. For this course, in lieu of an AP exam, students will submit a portfolio of work to the College Board for potential college credit.

The AP Program offers three portfolios: Drawing, 2-D Design, and 3-D Design. The portfolios share a basic, three-section structure, which requires the student to show a fundamental competence and range of understanding in visual concerns (and methods). It is recommended that some students provide their own materials for their medium.
