- Bring your course request sheet to your core teachers (English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and World Language) to discuss course recommendations for you.

STEP 3: Parent/Guardian Conversation

 Take home your course request handout and have an additional scheduling conversation with your parents/guardians. Then together, fill in your Final Student Request.

STEP 4: The Scheduling Conference

- Every student will meet with a school counselor for a brief, individual, scheduling conference.
- Students must bring their COMPLETED "Student Request Sheet" with all requests filled in.

STEP 5: Course Request Verification

• All schedule corrections, changes, and adjustments MUST be completed by March 4, 2022!

 As a reminder, the sooner a concern is addressed, the more likely that a suitable solution will be available.
