Found Clays:

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Do you or your siblings have any play doh at home? Try it out and see if it's still useable!
	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Try some Sculpey Brand clay if you haven't yet. It's a polymer or plastic based clay that you harden in your oven. You can buy a small pack at Hobby Lobby, Michael's or Wal-Mart or use some if you have it. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Any oil based clay around? Oil based clays NEVER dry out! That's kind of cool but also has some down sides.
	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● DIG your own clay! Ask parents first then find a spot in your yard or maybe someplace your family has already been excavating. The top layers are soil- the black/ deep brown grainy stuff- which isn't very useable. You'll have to go below this and find the sticky stuff that is tan/ yellow/ red-brown.
