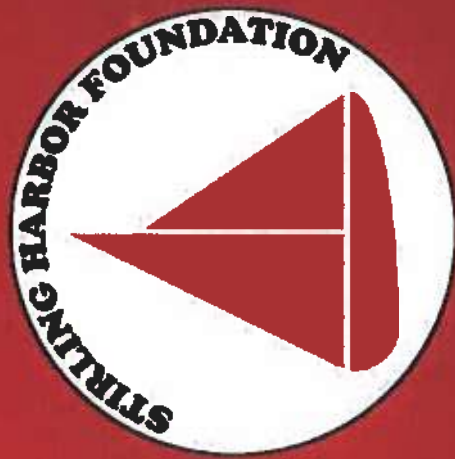

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CREATIVE WRITING

June 19 - June 24

A five-day creative writing trip aboard Arcadia lends itself to short stories and essays. We'll workshop in small groups, have independent time for assignments, and share what we write for peer feedback and editing.

July 17 - July 21

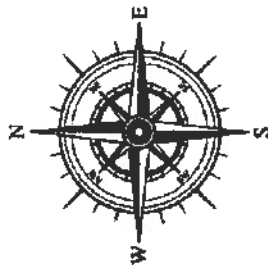
Join us for a trip to Mystic Seaport Museum in Connecticut. Underway, you'll begin to familiarize yourself with life aboard a boat and begin learning some local nautical history. A full day at Mystic Seaport includes tours of the Museum and time to explore exhibits.

programs, students will be highly involved in the daily operation of their ship. We focus heavily on traditional maritime practices as a platform for life skills.

LOCAL WATER QUALITY

July 24 - July 28

Take water samples and learn what's in our local water. We'll study salinity, temperature, nitrates, plankton, and more as we travel Long Island Sound and record our findings.

SAILING BASICS

A super-charged look at sailing. We'll talk about angles, lift, drag, displacement, lines, knots, and the list goes on!

LYRICS AND POETRY

August 14 - August 18

There's a good reason sailors make up songs and shanties! This trip will look at lyric writing and poetry, whether you want to write about your time ashore or aboard.

OCEAN MYTHOLOGY

August 21 - August 25

SHIP's mythology course is for anyone intrigued by sea gods and creatures. Learn about the Kraken, mermaids, Davy Jones, and (of course) Poseidon.
