
2020 Advanced Placement Mean Scores

The **SAT** tests reasoning and verbal abilities and is designed to assess students' academic readiness for college.



Class of 2020 Mean SAT Scores







Class of 2020 Mean ACT Scores



Naviance


Naviance is a web-based program where students can access many resources to find out how they learn best, what they are good at and what interests them, and how they can use that information to set goals and plan their future.


In 2019-20 school year 121 colleges visited MHS 1645 students registered for those visits








Counselor Visits to Colleges

Counselors will continue to visit colleges with unique programs or offerings to better inform our families.


