
ROCK CYCLE COMIC STRIP

- Metamorphic rock
- Heat
- Pressure
- Weathering

- Melting
- Sediment
- Cooling
- Lava
- Magma

- Intrusive
- Extrusive
- Strata/layers
- Transportation
- Law of Superposition
- Compacting
- Cementing
- 2. Underline and/or highlight the 12 words used from the list above.
- 3. You **must include** all 3 types of rock.
- 4. You should include details such as how each type of rock was formed. How did you move from stage to stage? Did you mix with other things as you were cemented together? Do you have layers?
- 5. Minimum number of 8 frames (boxes) in your comic strip or mini comic book.
- 6. **BE CREATIVE!** You **must include** a story line, illustrations, and color.
- 7. You may use a blank sheet of paper to create a "comic strip" format, or your teacher can provide you with a blank mini-template for your comic book.
