In the last Communicator there was a brief explanation of the Northwest Evaluation Association's (NWEA) Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessments in math and reading used at Lakeview. The NWEA assessment data, grade level assessment data and teacher input determine the best placement for your child for GOAL (Growth Oriented Active Learning) Time. GOAL Time is designed to meet the needs of <u>all students</u>, including instructional time to support our AmeriCorps, Title I, and Special Education students, plus challenges all students through enrichment opportunities.

We utilize research-based best practice intervention programs such as literacy groups, Explode the Code, automaticity math programs, Structured Language Instruction, Great Leaps, and several computerized programs to help all students during GOAL Time. Our teachers and instructional aides work together to ensure the best possible instruction is provided to all students.





All students in grades 1-4, no matter the group, will work on individual needs. Individual student growth is our focus during GOAL Time. Students placed in an intervention group have the benefit of working with a teacher and one or more instructional aides for both reading and mathematics. (Letters were sent home prior to this notice.) The intervention groups have fewer students so intervention can be student specific.

Again, we are goal focused for all students and want each student to be successful. We have 30 minutes for reading GOAL Time each day and 20 minutes for mathematics GOAL Time each day. There are times when other activities interrupt this schedule but we try to keep interruptions to a minimum.


