What are we doing in our art classes to support the Common Core Initiative?

- We infuse children's literature into our elementary lessons as the introduction to a new art project.
- We relate our art lessons to historical events and time periods, most intensely in courses such as AP Art History.
- We enhance students' competency in literacy through arts-specific, content-area vocabulary.
- We reinforce math by integrating quality, precise measuring, perspective, and the use and understanding of geometric shapes.
- We collaborate with teachers in other subject areas to connect our lessons with classroom units of study.

- We utilize interpretation, comparative analysis, critique, and in-depth studies of works similar to the critical analysis and evaluation of literary works.
- We endorse and incorporate repetitive reinforcement as a teaching strategy to obtain mastery learning.
- We teach our students how to listen and observe more intensely and with greater depth.
- We teach our students life-long organizational skills (portfolios) and proper work habits (home practice) that traverses all disciplines.
- We teach our students foreign languages such as Latin, Italian, French,
 Swahili, German, and American Sign Language throughout various global works of art.
- We encourage students to write self-reflections and construct selfassessments on their completed artwork and portfolios.
- We teach descriptive language as part of the art critiquing process.
- We promote and engage our students in the educational philosophy of *Graduation by Exhibition* in our portfolio assessments.
- We teach our students technology literacy in the art classroom, preparing them for the 21st Century work place.
- We integrate modern technologies within the classroom, and relate our art lessons to real-life scenarios.
- We encourage students to understand and appreciate other perspectives and cultures through art lessons.
- We allow students the use of digital media and visual projects/assignments to express their feelings and emotions.
