At our level the test is intended to assess student learning in mathematics and English language arts (ELA) for both third and fourth grades. Additionally, student learning in science will be assessed in fourth grade. This is one piece of information on a given day versus ongoing assessment that occurs daily/weekly in your child's classroom. Please know that we value the assessment and encourage children to do their best, coming to school prepared, well rested, and having a healthy breakfast. Being prepared physically and emotionally will allow your child to show all he/she knows and is able to do!

A Peer to Peer Program is a research-based system to support social skills development for students with disabilities. Similar programs are established in school districts throughout the state of Michigan with great success. Not only does this benefit our students with social needs, but parents and teachers alike have reported great benefits for the general education students as well.

If your child decides to become a Peer Support Student he or she will be working with/under the supervision of the special education staff and their general education teacher. As a part the Peer to Peer Program, your son or daughter would not miss any academic time. He or she would participate in typical school day activities, like lunch, recess, specials, reading buddies, or social skills group, along side a student with special needs.
