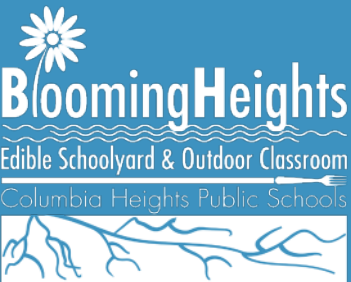

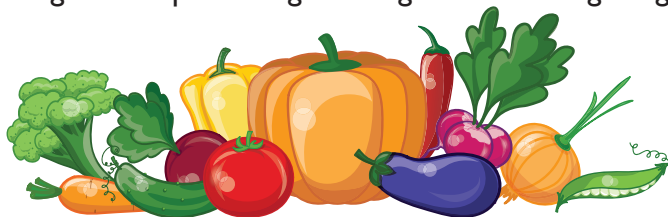

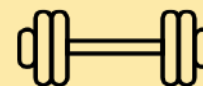

MSAA Scholastic Arts and Writing Awards

Fifteen Columbia Heights High School (CHHS) art students earned a total of 20 Gold Key, Silver Key and Honorable Mention awards at the 2022 Minnesota Scholastic Arts Awards (MSAA) – a competition organized by Art Educators of Minnesota. The art students received five Gold Key awards, eight Silver Key awards and eight Honorable Mentions.



Senior Simon Graves earned three awards, including a Gold Key (Editorial Cartoon category), and two Silver Keys (Editorial Cartoon and Art Portfolio categories). Senior Amara Thompson also earned a Gold Key (Poetry), along with Junior Daelen White (Photography), Sophomore Niomi Dillard (Photography) and Freshman Brittany Pekarek (Photography). Their artwork advances to the National Scholastic Art Awards competition in New York City, which will take place later this year.



In addition to Graves, Seniors Hoang Phong (Photography) and Eli Zhagnay (Drawing & Illustration), Juniors Alex Druley (Digital Illustration) and Wilson Apuparo Martinez (Photography), Sophomore Rosy Estrada (Photography) and Freshman Trista Kimmerling (Photography) earned Silver Key Awards.



Seven students were selected for Honorable Mentions. Class of 2022 recipients are Amina Jama (Personal Essay & Memoir), Connor Nelson (Photography), Phong (Photography) and Thompson (Painting). Juniors Druley (Digital Art x2) and Rae Lawrence (Journalism) received three Honorable Mentions between the two of them, and Sophomore Thantruc Mai received an Honorable Mention for Digital Art. The Minnesota Scholastic Art Awards was established in 1923 and is the longest-running program of its kind in the nation. All student award honorees were recognized at the 2022 MSAA ceremony, on Saturday, Feb. 26 at the Weisman Art Museum at the University of Minnesota.

Columbia Heights High School Names District Triple ‘A’ Award Winners

Columbia Heights High School (CHHS) seniors Kaylie Aquino and Drake Pham are this year’s Academics, Arts and Athletics Award (Triple ‘A’) students. Each year, high school seniors are selected for their participation in Minnesota State High School League (MSHSL) sponsored arts and athletics while maintaining high academic standing. They are eligible to receive a \$1,000 scholarship and were honored at the Triple ‘A’ on-court ceremony at the MSHSL Boys’ State Basketball Tournament that happened in March. CHHS students Aquino and Pham did not move on to the regional level to attend this ceremony, but have received their certificates for the Triple ‘A’ Award for the Columbia Heights Public School District.

To be eligible for the Triple ‘A’ Award nomination, a student must be a high school senior, have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher, participate in at least one MSHSL-sponsored athletic program and one arts/activity program, comply with the MSHSL’s Student Code of Conduct, complete the application form and submit it to the administrative region secretary by the deadline date specified by the region committee.

Aquino has participated in Band and Choir (Superior Rating) throughout high school and Tennis (Captain) while maintaining a 4.0 GPA. Pham has participated in Band (Superior Rating, All-Conference), Basketball, Track & Field (All-Conference Honorable Mention) and Key Club while maintaining a 4.0 GPA. CHPS is proud to have these leaders as a part of our school system and we are very excited to see what these two students do in the future.

Senator Kunesh also showed the guests her office and personal art collection, some of which is from artists from right here in District 41.

Columbia Heights Public Schools Offers Summer Meal Program

Columbia Heights Public Schools (CHPS) is excited to announce its participation in the USDA summer food programs. The USDA announced in early March 2021 they would extend their summer food programs to allow all children to continue to receive FREE nutritious meals this summer when schools are out of session. The district will have specific summer food sites that will be posted on our website and sent home to every family in the digital newsletter.

Columbia Heights Public Schools will begin serving meals at designated summer sites June 13. Summer meal service is available to all children age 18 and younger and persons over age 18 with mental or physical disabilities without charge. Meals will be provided on a first-come, first-served basis during specific serving times each day.
