## Maintenance Check

With this school year coming to an end on May 24th we are already finalizing our plans to get everything ready for the 2024-2025 school year

Every year our maintenance /custodial department surface, wax, and clean approximately 445,515 sq ft of flooring and space. We service 310 pieces of mechanical equipment including, HVAC, freezers, coolers, ice machines, water fountains, hot water boilers and water heaters. We do inspections and testing of all emergency lighting and fire alarms/doors.

During this summer's construction, 8 of our Elementary classrooms will be renovated and 18 mechanical units will be replaced by two larger more efficient units; the roof covering this section of the building will also be replaced. At the Middle School 4 bathrooms will be given a much needed facelift and will be updated with new fixtures along with the replacement of a 25 ton mechanical unit that provides heating and cooling for 6 classrooms and the middle school Science Lab.

As the school year has come to an end, this gives an opportunity to look back on the health of our students. Overall, we had a healthy school year and great compliance with immunizations required by the state of Missouri. This year many students were able to utilize services provided by Eye Thrive, Smiles to go Dental Van, PharMax Imperial, and also routine vision and hearing screenings from the school nurses. Many staff members also were able to utilize services from PharMax Imperial, Jefferson County Health Department Wellness Van, and St. Luke's Mobile Mammography Unit.

Keeping both staff and students healthy and in the classroom provides greater continuity and opportunity for uninterrupted flows in education. Students must be healthy to be educated and educated to be healthy.

Summer time is a great time to make sure your students are prepared for the incoming school year. Making sure your student is current on annual health visits and also their immunizations is a great way to start a new school year. Most incoming kindergarteners that have attended daycare or preschool have immunizations current for kindergarten, but this would be a great question for your child's primary physician. Incoming eighth graders are required to obtain a Tdap and Meningococcal vaccine and twelfth grade students are required to obtain a Meningococcal vaccine. If these immunizations are received over the summer, the paperwork can be sent to the school nurse to be updated in Infinite Campus. By having these immunizations prior to the start of school, additional work by the nurses to make phone calls will be minimized and much appreciated.

# Festus High School Project Lead The Way

Festus High School is leading the way when it comes to offering students an opportunity to explore different career paths. Project Lead The Way (PLTW) is one of those opportunities. PLTW is an engineering based program that has its roots in math, electronics and manufacturing. Ray Brooks is the Festus High School Project Lead the Way teacher. "Introduction to Engineering and Design" and "Principles of Engineering" were the only two PLTW classes the high school offered when Brooks arrived. But he realized something wasn't right. "So we found that we were missing the freshmen because they were going right into industrial tech," he observed. "So then a lot of them will never make it back down in this wing that could be very well mechanically inclined." The next year, the high school added a PLTW course called "Engineering Essentials." It is an entry level PLTW course and just right for freshmen or anyone interested in engineering. "So they start with Tinkercad [a computer program] and they learn how to 3D model. There's not a lot of details to that. It's just kind of simple, but it leads them into 'Intro To Engineering and Design' and then we teach them a little bit about electricity, parallel and series circuits, and how to read Ohm's law and what a resistor is and and just kind of build on that."

The big expansion to the program came this year. The school received a large grant from the Ardagh Corporation, so it started a new class called "Computer Integrated Manufacturing" and purchased a computerized numerical control (CNC) machine. This machine allows students to design something on the computer that can then be cut precisely using the CNC machine. "It's like the opposite of a 3D printer," said Brooks." "A 3D printer builds up material and this takes it away. So a CNC machine is used all over the industry in maintenance to make parts"


Rose Immekus is a senior at Festus High School. She says seeing the end result is very gratifying, "There's a lot of problem solving that came before we could actually hold it. So by the time we held it, it was very exciting to just know that the effort was worth it." She says it has solidified her decision to pursue a career in computer engineering, "I was kind of like computer science, computer engineering because I loved coding, but seeing how it helps make things, it has made me want to go all the way to computer engineering."

In February, the Festus School District hosted a number of other Districts from the area at a Project Lead The Way showcase. Festus students explained what each class teaches, some demonstrated new skills they learned, and they answered questions about the Festus PLTW program. District leaders came away showcase impressed by the Festus program.

The District has plans to expand its Project Lead The Way offerings into the Middle School beginning next school year, and perhaps in the high school in the coming years. Immekus says this kind of class can be for anyone, "It's really good because even if you're not trying to be on the engineering side, you can be on the working side. So if you're trying to work in some type of factory that uses CNC machines, you can pursue those and understand how the machinery works. So it kind of shows you






