• name and define the parts of the instruments

# INSTRUMENTAL TECHNIQUES / FORMS / EMBOUCHURES / POSITION AND POSTURE

- demonstrate proper embouchures and position
- demonstrate appropriate warm-up techniques

#### TONE PRODUCTION

- produce a characteristic tone on the instrument
- demonstrate appropriate tuning techniques characteristic to their instrument

#### BEATS / METER / TEMPO / RHYTHM

- perform on the instrument to a steady beat
- read and perform pieces in simple and compound meters
- recognize and define tempo markings and apply them in performance
- clap accurately and perform rhythms from notation
- analyze rhythm rotation in varying meters

#### PITCH / MELODY

- accurately perform melodic selections with accurate note naming and fingering on instruments
- demonstrate appropriate musical phrasing of melodic lines

#### HARMONY / TONALITY

perform selected major and minor scales in appropriate keys

# MUSICAL EXPRESSION DYNAMICS, PHRASING, ARTICULATION, INTERPRETIVE DEVICES

- define dynamics, articulation, phrasing, concepts, interpretive, and stylistic devices
- perform musical selections expressively, applying appropriate stylistic devices

#### TIMBRE AND TEXTURE

• recognize monophonic, polyphonic, homophonic textures within band literature

#### FORM AND STYLE

• recognize musical forms such as AB, ABA, rondo fugues, hymns, marches, chorale, overture, and novelty

• identify characteristics of each historical period of music including eras, nationalities, technologies, composers, conductors, performers, and styles of music
