The 2010-2011 OSPI NBPTS Conditional Loan application essays are evaluated and scored by Washington State National Board Certified Teachers (NBCTs) using the following rubric. Each essay question is scored by two NBCTs and if there is a deviation greater than one point a third reading is required. The scores for the essays constitute only a portion of the total scholarship score. Because of the volume of essays, scores for individual scholarships will not be released.
