

Contour Line Still-Life








- 1. Arrange 6 still-life objects in the center of the table. Be sure that they overlap to help show depth or distance.
- 1. On 9x12 paper, draw out the shapes. Use strong solid lines not sketchy lines. (Remember: a contour line is a line that represents an outline of the subject/object).
- 1. Think about the proportions: the comparison of elements one to another in terms of size.
- 1. Accurately draw the shapes, the placement, and the size of the objects.
- 1. Balance the positive and negative space.

ELEMENT OF ART THAT IS A CONTINUOUS MARK.

THERE ARE FIVE KINDS.

- Horizontal
- Vertical
- Diagonal
- ZigZag
- Curved



LINE: ELEMENT OF ART THAT IS A CONTINUOUS MARK. THERE ARE FIVEKINDS.

Vertical: Lines that are straight up and down

Horizontal: Lines parallel to the horizon

Diagonal: Lines that slant

Curved: Lines that are always bending and turning

Zigzag: Lines that are formed by short, sharp
