Check the size.





















## ABSTRACT ART

#### MILK AND FOOD COLORING ABSTRACT ART VIDEO TUTORIAL

- A. Try adding dish soap to water with food coloring-get in close and take photos
- B. Try coating a piece of (plexi)glass with rain-x then spraying it with water. Place the glass a few inches above colored paper or objects. Focus on the water droplets on the glass-COOL!
