Course Description: This is an introductory course that will explore the methods of creating artwork. Instruction will focus on utilizing 2-dimensional and 3-dimensional media as well as the basic understanding of the elements and principles of design. An additional focus will include discussion regarding the development, use, and changes to art throughout history and critique. **Students are required to pay the art supply fee in order to provide the necessary materials for the course (\$40).**

Learning Outcomes: Students will gain the ability to create artwork through observation with a variety of media as well as develop the proper skills required to create original artwork. Students will also develop writing and analytical skills to discuss works of art from different eras by academic writing (short answers, a paper) and actively participating in group critique. Completed original artwork may be displayed in art exhibitions or entered into art contests.

Attendance: Your presence is not only required, but wanted! How else will you learn how to create a masterpiece?

Course Etiquette/ Classroom Expectations:

- Be ready and willing to work. Bring your supplies as needed.
- Use all media, supplies, and art objects as directed (they need love too).
- Know your neighbor, ask questions, and collaborate. This is a cooperative subject. Don't be afraid to ask for or provide help.

Classroom Rules:

- No food or drink allowed in the art room.
- When not used for lessons, cellphones are to be completely out of sight and not heard.
