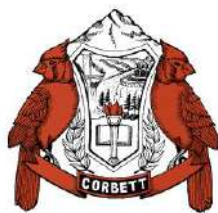

Our Community

Corbett School District is located in unincorporated Corbett, Oregon, just 22 miles from downtown Portland, Oregon and at the mouth of the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area. Corbett offers the best of both worlds: the sense of community and quality of life that are part of small-town living as well as access to a culturally vibrant, metropolitan city.

Our School

Corbett High School has been recognized as one of the highest performing schools in the country by The Washington Post, Newsweek, and US News and World Reports. Students are challenged by a prolific Advanced Placement for All program; a program that also produces one of the highest graduation rates in the state.

A seven-period class schedule is offered to all students on a trimester system.

Extensive student activity programs include athletics, drama, music, philanthropy, student leadership, and FIRST Robotics.

In addition to the traditional 9-12 academic programming, Corbett High School offers an 8/9 Academy, in which 8th grade students are co-seated with 9th graders.

Each grade level has between 90 and 110 students. The K-12 district supports approximately 1200 students.

Demographically, Corbett High School is 10% Hispanic, 8% Two or more ethnicities, <1% American Indian/Alaskan Native, 2% Asian, 2% Black/African American, <1% Pacific Islander, and 77% White. 22% of students are identified as economically disadvantaged.

Graduation Requirements

Corbett offers a 28 credit diploma, 4 more credits than the Oregon State Standard Diploma. Graduates are also required to be accepted to a college, and take 4 Advanced Placement courses.

Corbett High School participates in a Middle College program with Mt. Hood Community College. Juniors and Seniors can elect to take some of their course work at MHCC.

Grading System

Students receive letter grades based on their achievement in each class. The letter grade is based on the teacher's professional evaluation of student achievement and master of course content.

Grade point average is determined using a four-point system for non-weighted, a five point system for weighted. Both averages will be reported on student transcripts.

A "P" for a class may be awarded to indicate that a student has passed the course, which is not factored in the GPA. We do not rank students.

COVID-19 Changes

All Oregon schools were closed from March 16th, 2020, through the end of the school year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. During this time, instruction was delivered per the Oregon Department of Education's "Distance Learning for All" guidance, and Pass/Incomplete grades were used for Trimester 3 of 2020.

Corbett Schools utilized full comprehensive distance learning for the first trimester. Our schedule switched from a 7 period day to a 3.5 period block schedule – classes meet every day for 6 weeks, and then alternate to the second set of classes. This could continue throughout the year if state officials require schools to remain online. Oregon Department of Education waived the Essential Skills and Personalized Learning for the class of 2021.

Post-High School Plans

Of the 96 graduates in 2020 89% had committed to a 4-year university, a 2-year community college, an apprenticeship program, or a trade school
