We invite and encourage parents of students in grades 8-10 to participate in the course selection meetings, in person or by phone. - suggested questions to consider as these individual decisions are made

Important Dates to Remember

I. January/February 2024:

- ⇒ Course recommendations for all core content area courses are visible to students/parents on the eSchool portal.
- ⇒ School counselors meet with students to review course recommendations and choose elective courses. Parents of students in grade 8-10 are invited and encouraged to participate. Please share your availability through the grade-specific form and the counselor will confirm your appointment date and time:

Grade 9 Appointment Preferences
Grade 10 Appointment Preferences

Please note: Juniors will meet with their counselor in early January. Parents will be invited to participate in the junior conference (March - May) to discuss post high school plans and review course selections for senior year.

II. March 4, 2024: Course requests will be locked and master schedule build will begin. Changes to course requests will not be made after this date; level changes will be reviewed as needed.

Where Do We Begin?


Learning occurs when students are clear about what they should know (FACTS), what they should understand (CONCEPTS) and what they should be able to do (SKILLS). The academic planning process includes these same important components. As counselors meet with students and families, the framework below will assist in guiding this important process.

FACTS: We begin with collecting and reviewing the student's individual academic record and discussing their current and previous school experience. We ensure all information is available and ready for use: course recommendations, grade-specific course options, Program of Study to reference for more information about courses, scheduling timeline and student academic record.

CONCEPTS: The counselors then assist students in understanding the information that should impact the decision-making process including, time commitments related to personal in-school and out-of-school schedules, the expectations of various course offerings, how students' strengths and interests connect with available options, current personal goals and possible future plans.

SKILLS: When done well, students are able to apply knowledge (facts) and understanding (concepts) to create a personalized academic program that is appropriately rigorous and challenging. Students also will know if and when they need to access support, and where they can find it within our school. The ability to know their own strengths, the areas in which they need to improve, their own personal goals, and how and when to turn to others for assistance and support will help maximize their success.

We hope this framework will assist all students and families as we embark on this year's course selection and academic planning process.

As students and parents begin to explore the many course options available for next school year, it is important to be aware of the valuable resources that have been created for this purpose. These *steps* can provide the pathway to a successful course selection process:

First, each grade level has a specific planning sheet that includes all core content area courses (on the front) and all elective options (on the back). As families explore the needs and wants to fill our school's nine period day, these grade-specific sheets provide a snapshot of all that is available.



Then, students and parents are encouraged to discuss expectations related to academic achievement, student activities, time constraints, and personal obstacles. Working together to identify areas of interest and strength while understanding what can be difficult and challenging, can assist when making final decisions. An important resource that can help students and families determine the time commitment for certain courses can be found **HERE**. Please reference this important document during these conversations.

Finally, students and parents will meet with the counselors to review the teacher recommendations, course offerings, individual student time commitments in and out of school, and personal goals and challenges. It is a good idea to find **BALANCE** - an appropriate level of rigor and challenge that will excite you and help you maximize your potential while also building in opportunities for achievable success, downtime, and fun.

SENIORS:

Mid-Year Grades Reminder

After second quarter grades are posted, the counseling center will submit midyear grade reports to all colleges each student has applied to thus far. Please be aware of the following:

- Grades must be finalized at the end of the marking period. Any grade changes that are made after report cards are posted risks an inaccurate report being sent to a college. Reports will be re-sent if grade changes are made, but this can be disruptive to the application process.
- * Check your current performance, assignments and assessments. If you need to make up work, hand in assignments and/or take an assessment, make sure all are addressed before the end of the marking period (January 26).

Winter and Spring with the Class of 2025!

The high school counselors will be working with students in classroom sessions on January 3rd and 4th during the *College Kick-Off Part III* classroom sessions. These final classroom sessions will allow students to engage in individual Naviance college searches as they are guided by our school counselors to use this program most effectively.

During these sessions, students will be told more about the <u>JUNIOR BIO</u> which is a cornerstone of the college exploration and planning process. Most of the Junior Bio includes information from the student, but there is also a section for parents. The information shared will help as the students, families and counselors work together over the next several months to navigate the college application process.

Much time and attention goes into finding the right home for students after high school. There are many wonderful options that can be a great match for a student. When students begin to use Naviance as one tool in this process, they can narrow down this list of options and begin to find their optimal group of choices.

Junior college planning conferences will begin with students and parents in early March, after the course selection process is completed. We look forward to working together during this exciting time!

CSH JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL SCHOOL COUNSELING PROGRAM

Grade 6 to 7 Course Selection Process: Students transitioning from Lloyd Harbor School or West Side School will be assigned to their 7th grade courses over the winter months. There are a few options for students/families to choose, and information regarding these choices will be shared with students and parents. Students will meet the junior high school team during visits to 6th grade classrooms in early February. During these visits, Ms. Harman (assistant principal), Ms. Pickering (school counselor), Dr. Main (school psychologist) and faculty from the junior high school will share information about academic and transition issues. Students will learn about the courses they can choose (e.g., Spanish Language, French language, band, orchestra, chorus and general music) as well as courses they may be recommended for or identified to take in grade 7 (e.g., math lab, English lab, and/or Pre-Algebra 1). Information will be shared with parents and choices will be requested from families in early February for world language and music options.

Grade 7 to 8 Course Selection Process: Students currently in grade 7 will be assigned their courses from grade 8 during the winter months. The few options students/families choose include music, art and/or TV Production and Broadcasting (Hawk Talk). Ms. Pickering will provide information to families about these options and the process for making choices; the Grade 8 Program Planning Sheet will be used for each student.

Grade 8 to 9 Course Selection Process: Students currently in grade 8 begin to have more choices regarding their course selections as they enter the high school. All families are encouraged to review the grade-specific course selection sheet for grade 9. Parents are invited to participate when Ms. Pickering meets with each student, and parents can request dates/times for these meetings using this FORM.

Junior High School Counseling CANVAS Pages: Please note that the 7th and 8th grade CANVAS pages that Ms. Pickering has been maintaining and sharing with students and families will be merged into one (1) junior high school counseling CANVAS page starting in January 2024. All the important information, and more, that has been available to families on both pages will continue to be found on the new page. Please review this page regularly!

Mental Wellness Month: As we move into 2024, we look forward to continuing to address wellness for all students - mental wellness as well as physical wellness. Last spring, our junior high school team initiated Mental Wellness Month in May. This will be repeated in May 2024 with even more activities, reminders and practices to support each member of our school community. Stay tuned for more information over the next few months, and please remember to make personal wellness an ongoing priority.

Course Selection Reminders:

A student's high school course schedule allows them to engage in academic options that are rigorous, interesting and rewarding. Thoughtful planning includes a balance of challenging coursework with opportunities to meet with success. As you choose from the many options, you are encouraged to think about your four-year high school plan and your academic goals. Some questions you may want to ask yourself include:

- •Which subjects interest me most?
- •Where do I find the most success?
- •What are my strengths?
- •What challenges me most?
- •How much time can I commit to my school coursework and my other activities?

Decisions that are made during the course selection process lead to the creation of the master schedule and course placement. It is important to make thoughtful decisions while factoring in the level of rigor of each course, the overall commitment of the entire course schedule, and the ability to balance school and other commitments. Student transcripts ultimately reflect courses taken and grades earned. Careful planning with the end in mind can lead to success.

FAFSA: Free Application for Federal Student Aid

The **FAFSA** (Free Application for Federal Student Aid is scheduled to be released on December 31, 2023. This anticipated launch date was postponed this year from the usual October date due to changes that have been made to the FAFSA. All families who are seeking financial aid for college must submit the FAFSA. Please note: Some colleges require the FAFSA to be submitted for consideration of any/all aid on campus, so it is important to review individual college guidelines on their financial aid webpages.
