All seniors need to be sure they are getting enrolled for next fall. Dodge City Community College will host Enrollment Days on April 25 or 26, May 2 or 3, or there are three days available in June and July. At Enrollment Days there will be placement testing (if necessary), enrolling in classes, financial aid, housing, student ID, and more. And there will be giveaways on each day. Barton Community College has already had two enrollment days. It has two more in late April, three in May, and six during the summer. Find out more about BCC at enroll.bartonccc.edu. Some schools may only have a few enrollment days. If you want to have more choices, enrolling as soon as possible is the best outcome.

Students applying to Emporia State for summer or fall 2024 during the month of April will have the chance to win one of five \$1,000 scholarships. Drawings will take place weekly throughout the month. To start their application, send students to emporia.edu/apply. Limit one application scholarship per student.

Students admitted for summer or fall 2024 to ESU who sign up for Hornet Connection or set up an enrollment appointment with their admissions counselor by May 1 will be entered into a \$5,000 scholarship drawing. This drawing will take place on Wednesday, May 1. To sign up for Hornet Connection, go to emporia.edu/hornetconnection. Students who apply, get admitted and register for enrollment could potentially win both a \$1,000 application scholarship and the \$5,000 enrollment scholarship.

Kansas State will host the Young Writers Workshop June 24-28. Work with experienced teachers, dig into your imagination, and command the language to create original, inventive works of writing.

Meet with published writers -- slam poets, graphic novelists, oral historians, and playwrights -- who will share advice on where to get ideas, how to get going, and why they write. There is no cost to attend.

The K-State Contemporary Dance Camp is an all-inclusive college dance experience for high school students entering grades 9-12. Campers will explore contemporary dance technique, conditioning, and creative practice led by K-State faculty and guest teachers, culminating in a performance. Between classes, campers will have the

opportunity to experience campus life and the Manhattan community through daily activities such as bowling, movie nights, pool time, and team building exercises.
