Dakota Corps Scholarship Deadline: December 15 This scholarship provides a scholarship to students who agree to pursue their postsecondary education in South Dakota AND to remain in the state to work in a designated Critical Need Occupation for the number of years they received scholarship funding, plus one year. DO YOU QUALIFY?

- Graduate from SD HS
- 2.8 GPA or higher
- 27 ACT Composite or Superscore
- Pursuing a Critical Need Occupation
- Attend a participating SD College

Applicants for this scholarship must be a high school senior from South Dakota, North Dakota, Montana, Wyoming or Nebraska. The application must include an essay of 500 words or more about "Advancing My Western Heritage **Through Continuing Education and** Career". Packet must also include specified personal information (found on the application), a letter of acceptance for the post-secondary school you plan to attend, a letter of recommendation from a school administrator/staff, high school transcript, and current color portrait of the applicant. There are 16 scholarships awarded annually which are separated into 5 categories. The categories and requirements are listed on the application. The deadline for applications is December 18, 2022. Applications MUST be emailed or postmarked NO LATER than December 18, 2022. To apply visit WesternLegacyFoundation.com or stop in the counselors' office to pick up an application and scholarship details.

<u>Other Scholarship Opportunities</u> There are several scholarships with deadlines already approaching. **Don't delay!** These are updated constantly. **YOU** need to be checking this <u>link</u> OFTEN!! It is updated frequently for your benefit.

<u>Academic Scholarship</u> <u>Deadlines:</u>

Pay attention to the scholarship deadlines of the schools you've applied to and been accepted. Some schools have specific scholarships with priority deadlines. Check with your admissions counselor at each school to ensure that you complete your application on time. **BE YOUR OWN** ADVOCATE!

You've applied for Financial Aid. What's next?

- You are going to receive an "Award Letter". This tells you what aid (if any) and how much you will be receiving. You need to accept/decline each item.
- If your financial aid package includes federal student loans, your school will tell you how to accept the loan.
- You will be required to:
 - complete <u>ENTRANCE COUNSELING</u>-a tool to ensure you understand your obligation to repay the loan
 - sign a contract called an <u>MPN (MASTER PROMISSORY</u> <u>NOTE</u>), agreeing to the terms of the loan

<u>Where Can You Find Information About</u> <u>the Student Loans You've Received?</u>

Visit <u>My Aid</u> (using your FSA ID to log in) to view information about all of the federal student loans and other financial aid you have received and to find contact information for the loan servicer for your loans.

<u>Athletic Participation Post-High School</u> Some students desire to compete athletically at the next level. Is that you? If so, there are a couple things you should know.

You can compete at a college/university that is either <u>NCAA (DI, DII, DIII)</u> or <u>NAIA</u> affiliated. Both have different requirements and guidelines.

- NCAA- you need to create an account with the <u>NCAA Eligibility Center</u>
 - NCAA Guide
- <u>NAIA</u>- you need to register with the NAIA Eligibility Center by creating a profile at <u>PlayNAIA.org</u>. NAIA requires students to send specific documentation to be eligible to compete.

How Much Will College Cost? Great question! Every school's tuition/fees/expenses will be slightly different.

Do your research! Go to the University/College website and search "TUITION".

Most tuition information is going to be presented as "per semester", and remember that it will be based on how many credits you take.

Get your calculator out and start doing the math! A full-time student will need to take AND PASS 12 credit hours. To receive all of your Federal Financial Aid (this amount will be on your Award Letter), you must enroll (and pass) as a full-time student. [You may receive partial amounts of aid as a part-time student which is 6 credit hours per semester.]

Now. Let's do some Math!

EXAMPLE:

- Tuition-\$250 (per credit)
- Fees:
 - Activity fee- \$40 (per credit)
 - Special Discipline Fee (undergraduate: per credit)-\$30
- Automobile Registration-\$100 (for the year)
- Books/supplies- \$400-\$600 (per semester) -Using 12 credit hours:

(12 x 250)+(12 X 40)+(12 X 30)+100+ 400 = Fall semester Bill

*This doesn't include residence hall, food plan or any other fees and costs associated with each specific school. And we only based it off of 12 credit hours-the bare minimum to be a full-time student.

Do your research! Math doesn't lie. It will give you a good understanding of what your financial obligation will be. Don't be shocked! Ignorance isn't always bliss!
