Mixed Chorus, Grades 9 - 12

Course Description:

The Choral program offers students of varying levels of interest and talent the opportunity to participate in Mixed Chorus through large and small ensembles and solo activities. Students are encouraged to develop to their own musical ability. Various styles of choral music are studied and performed. Student's vocal techniques and musicianship are developed.

The Mixed Chorus performs at Winter and Spring Concerts and various musical performances throughout the year. Mixed Chorus is a full year, 3 credit course.

Course Rationale:

Performing, creating and responding to music are the fundamental music processes in which humans engage. Through singing, moving to music and creating music, students acquire musical skills and knowledge that can be developed in no other way. Students must understand their own historical and cultural heritage and those of others within their communities and beyond to participate fully in a diverse, global society. Music provides an outlet for creativity and for self-expression. Music exalts the human spirit; it enhances the quality of life.

The students represent the school in public concerts, auditions and other functions and thereby develop personal traits of leadership, poise and dependability as well as develop high morale and maintain school spirit. The Mixed Chorus offers an opportunity for mutual effort and success. The knowledge that the group's successful performance is reliant on the practice and perfection of each individual's contribution is an asset to the family, the school and later in the workplace.
