


Craig Thompson is a graphic novel artist currently living in Portland, Oregon.

He has won several awards for his art and writing.




Although he worked for Dark Horse Comics for a short time, he is best known for his graphic novels.

Good-bye Chucky Rice was his first major release.


The story was a semibiographical, yet highly fictionalized account of how it FELT to move from Wisconsin to Oregon.







Look at his composition, use of hatching for texture/ value, repetition, contrast etc. in this one panel.









His most famous novel is Blankets.


This book has won or been nominated for several awards.


This story is autobiographical. It focuses on growing up in a poor Christian family. It also deals with finding and eventually losing his first "love".




Blankets are used throughout the book as a symbol of comfort, youthfulness and love.











Carnet De Voyage was a travel journal that he wrote while doing a book signing and making sketch references for elements from his next book.

He draws land features, architecture and people from his journey. He also talks about his issues with arthritis and joint pain caused by his obsessive art style.





Here is one of the sketches from Carnet De Voyage




Habibi is a 672 page graphic novel that took him around 7 years to complete.











He has also made several short drawings and illustrations for various topics.
