COURSE DESCRIPTION

Criminal Justice is an introduction to the inner workings of the three significant criminal justice functions in the United States; Law Enforcement, Courts, and Corrections. During the 2021-2022 school year, students will interact with members of law enforcement, corrections, and the court system while learning basic fundamentals as well as from trained professional work experiences. The use of video, audio, and slide presentations will expose students to the realities of the Criminal Justice profession. Introduction to Criminal Justice will expose students to real-life examples that encourage critical and creative thinking skills, ethical decision-making skills, and employability skills needed to journey throughout life, as well as prepare for college and/or the workforce.
