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Each year, the Lynchburg-Clay School District offers career and technical education programs in conjunction with Great Oaks. These programs are designed to prepare youth for a broad range of employment and training services and are offered under the guidance of certified teachers, counselors, and cooperative education coordinators. These programs are designed:

- A. for careers and continued education;
- B. for entry in the labor market as employable individuals immediately after graduation with productive, saleable skills;
- C. to pursue education beyond high school with the opportunity to gain a marketable job skill(s) that will assist them in achieving career goals;
- D. to participate successfully in the world of work while continuing their education in order to help offset higher education expenses.

The Board shall provide in cooperation with Great Oaks Institute of Technology a career-technical education program that may include workforce development programs from the following career fields:

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| A. Agricultural and Environment Education; | H. Hospitality and Tourism; |
| B. Arts and Communication; | I. Human Services; |
| C. Business and Administrative Services; | J. Information Technology; |
| D. Construction Technologies; | K. Law and Public Safety; |
| E. Education and Training; | L. Manufacturing Technologies; |
| F. Engineering and Science Technologies; | M. Marketing; |
| G. Health Science; | N. Transportation Systems. |

CRITERIA for ADMISSION

Sophomores are able to apply and attend as Juniors and Seniors. Applicants are accepted based on their applications and contingent upon passing core classes as Freshman and Sophomores. The students are also able to apply to a campus other than Laurel Oaks. **All career and technical education programs follow the district's policies of nondiscrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex and disability in all programs, services, activities, and employment. In addition, arrangements can be made to ensure that the lack of English language proficiency is not a barrier to admission or participation.**
