Hello Parents/Guardians!

Another exciting MAES Spelling Bee is in the works!

This year's competition will be in-class competitions for grades 1-3. The 4th graders will have an in-class competition with the winners graduating to a 4th grade competition. The winner of that will move on to the Regional Competition.

Classroom Spelling Bees

- This is a completely optional competition.
- Have your student learn the words on the grade-level study words list provided by your student's teacher.
- Classroom bees will take place during the week of November 27-Dec 1.
- On Competition Day, your student's teacher will use the grade-level list of words, starting with the first word, and go in order. These words will not be in the order of the study words list.
- If the student starts to spell the word incorrectly, they can't go back and start again. They have spelled the word incorrectly and are eliminated at that point.
- The teacher will keep going until the students are narrowed down to a winner and, for the 4th grade, an alternate (alternates will compete in the finals if the winner is absent on competition day).
- Winners and alternates need to be selected by December 1.

4th Grade Spelling Bee (finals)

- One winner from each 4th Grade classroom will compete (the classroom alternate will compete if the winner is absent on the day of competition)
- The FULL LIST of WORDS will be used. The list will come home on December 1 to study for the winner and alternate only.
- 4th Grade Bee will take place on Tuesday December 19 at 1:30 (snow date December 20). Parents of the classroom winners and alternates will be invited to attend
- A pronouncer will read the word aloud clearly for the speller and use it in a sentence.
- The speller can:
 - Ask for the word to be repeated
 - Ask for a definition
- If the speller starts to spell the word incorrectly, they can't go back and start again. They have spelled the word incorrectly and are eliminated at that point.
- o A recorder will record each word spelled the way the student spells it.
- The final Bee winner must spell the final word correctly in a final spelling round.
 If the last two spellers both get their words wrong, they will both continue until one is correct and the other is incorrect.
- The winner of the school Bee will move on to the regional spelling bee (more info to come).
