

Curriculum Map: 10 Academic English
Course: ACADEMIC ENGLISH 10 Sub-topic: English

Grade(s): 10

Course Description: Academic English 10 is a standards-based course designed to enhance the skills necessary for success in a career, college, or any postsecondary training the student chooses to pursue. The year contains a review of the mechanics of the language—capitalization, punctuation, usage, and grammar. These will be addressed through the student’s writing and in as-needed mini-lessons. In literature, students study poetry, short stories, the novel, and drama as a part of theme-based units. Specifically, students study the themes of The American Dream, Moral Struggle, Coming-of-Age, and Innocence to Experience. In addition, students read four independent novels over the course of the semester. During this semester, students are required to take weekly vocabulary quizzes using Membean, an online, interactive program. Students also will be exposed to Latin with weekly cumulative quizzes. Vocabulary and Latin lessons are designed to improve students’ vocabulary skills with the intent to improve SAT scores and reading comprehension. Students will complete multiple writing assignments, ranging from speeches to analytical essays as a part of this course. Students will also participate in Keystone Exam targeted preparation designed to ensure their success on the Keystone Exam. Students will also engage in weekly writing assignments, ranging from creative to research-based.
