






Michelangelo was an Italian painter, poet, sculptor and architect. He painted the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel in Rome and sculpted the famous David.







The biggest dinosaur, Brachiosaurus, was the length of two school buses and the height of a four-story building. It had a lengthy neck and a massive tail.









No. During the day deserts reach sweltering temperatures of 100 °F or higher. At night, the temperature drops to a cool 45 °F or even lower!






Yes, it spins like a top and also travels around the sun at the same time. It takes the Earth one day to turn on its axis. This turning motion gives us day and night.



Yes, the Statue of Liberty was a gift from France to the United States. This statue stands as a reminder to all Americans of the freedom we enjoy.




What does "invertebrate" mean?






How many bones do we have?





There are only four words in the English language that end in "dous": tremendous (great), horrendous (terrible), stupendous (fantastic) and hazardous (risky).





The sculpted faces depict George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt and Abraham Lincoln. They represent the first 130 years of American history.







Which is the biggest spider in the world?




The tarantula is the biggest spider in the world. They can be up to 11 inches long.
