PA Core Standards in 2014-2015

As children across Pennsylvania begin a new school year, they will be learning to new, stronger academic standards in English and Math called the Pennsylvania Core Standards. These standards are not curriculum, but rather an outline of what students should know by the end of each grade level. To measure the progress that students are making toward achieving the standards, schools assess student performance on the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA) tests in grades 3 through 8 and the Keystone Exams in high school.

This school year (2014-15), there will be changes to the reading, writing and math PSSAs that students in grades 3-8 take in the spring to reflect that the tests are now aligned to the Pennsylvania Core Standards. As a result of this alignment, the separate writing PSSAs in grades 5 and 8 will be eliminated and instead all students in grades 3-8 will take an English Language Arts PSSA that includes both reading and writing. Implementing the stronger academic standards and measuring how well students are doing on tougher PSSA tests may result in an initial decline in test scores when they are released in the fall of 2015. This drop in scores is not unexpected and should not be interpreted as a decline in student learning or teacher performance. It means we are recalibrating our expectations and raising the bar for student achievement to ensure our kids are on a pathway to graduate from high school postsecondary and workforce ready.

Riverview School District K-12 Writing Framework Update

Over the summer, a group of teachers who have been involved with the initiation of the Riverview School District K-12 Writing Framework came together to begin developing the structure and strategies we will eventually use across all content areas, K-12, in the Riverview School District. On August 21st, a team of teachers presented the preliminary strategies developed by the larger K-12 committee. Posters were disseminated for every classroom in the school district, intended to consistently and visually reinforce meta-cognitive strategies they can use to initiate their writing process in the classroom. We look forward to supporting the continued development of this framework throughout the 2014-2015 school year.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT IN 2014-2015:

USING DATA TO INFORM THE DEVELOPMENT OF RCEPS



In the Riverview School District, we value our small class sizes and the personalized attention we are able to provide for our students. Personalized learning plans are an important part of our new Strategic Plan.

In August our teachers had the opportunity to learn more about OnHands Schools, as the district worked closely with Dr. Biancaniello, a specialized consultant from OnHands. Our teachers were provided with an overview of the new features available in OnHands, which is used to analyze a variety of student data. Our teachers examined ways to sort student data, and considered how the analysis features in OnHands can be used to develop targeted lessons and created Riverview Customized Education Plans (RCEPs) for our students. As we move into the 2014-2015 school year., our teachers will examine data and refine RCEPs to meet our students' needs. At the secondary level, our new Junior High Concept and High School Mentoring Program will provide support for our older students based on their interests, needs, and talents.



School and District Safety

Our teachers and staff returned to school to commence the 2014-2015 school year, and had the opportunity to engage in School Safety Training conducted by Sam Rosenberg, President of the Inpax Academy. Our local Law Enforcement and School Safety Director, Mr. Dunkle, worked with Dr. Hasselman, the leader of the community group that arranged and provided the donation that provided the Inpax Training. Our staff engaged in sessions that shared strategies that are parts of Automatic Critical Incident Response Tactics (ACIRT). Riverview will now explore possible Train the Trainer modules and will seek volunteers to engage in additional Inpax training, which we will continue to offer to our staff.



Strategic Planning Summary



The Comprehensive Planning Committee engaged in a long-range planning process following insights gleaned through various surveys, sub-committees and alumni and workforce panel discussions in 2013. We convened more formally to chart the course for the district on February 13, March 3, April 7, and June 10, 2014.
