 - → Nightly HW Expectations

◆ CP: 15 minutes

♦ Honors: 25 minutes

AP: 60 minutesWeekends: 1 night

◆ No HW over extended breaks (Thanksgiving, Winter, Spring)

• If holiday extends a weekend or during the week, then weekend policy applies

→ Turn-in Deadline

- ◆ No earlier than 8 am the next school day
 - Jachym then she can't grade early in the morning, but she understands
 - Stout before Covid, kids didn't turn in until the next class. That's why decided on "no earlier" than 8 am
 - Zvanut if given a long time to do a research paper, then having it lock at 11:59 pm on the day it's due should be acceptable.
 - Stout Shouldn't matter if due at midnight or 8am. Some kids work better in the early morning with their busy schedules. Also, if due by the end of class, then collect it. Otherwise it is late. Once it's allowed to go home, then it is HW

→ Late Policy

- ♦ On time, earns 100%
