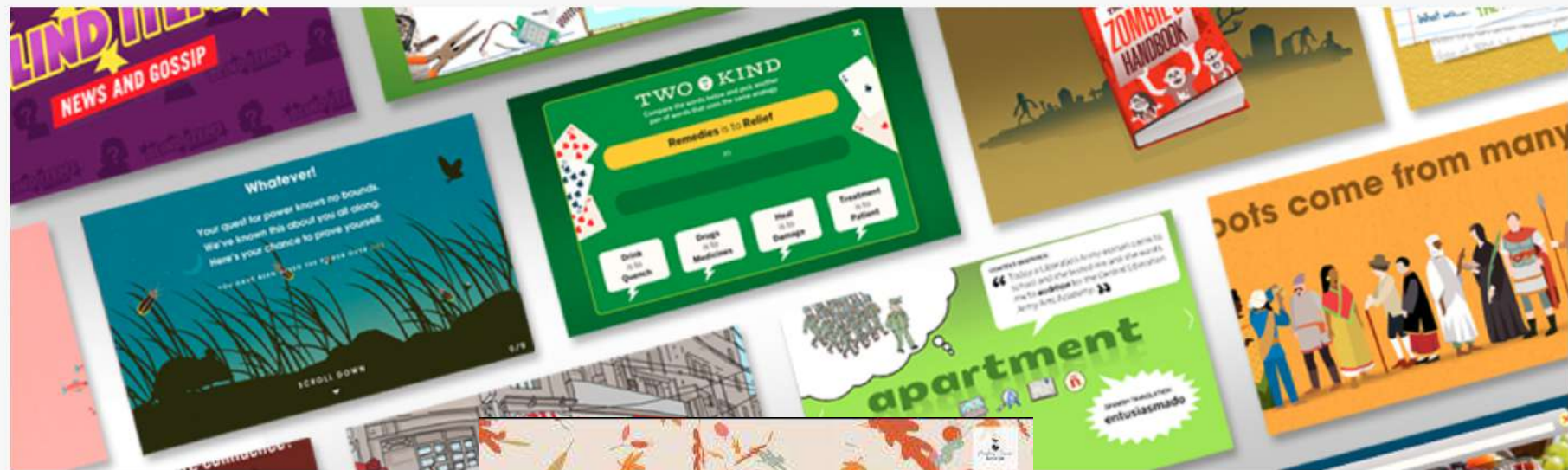

ESSAY PROMPT:

Whom does Dahl describe as causing more trouble: the boys or the adults? Use details from one moment in the book to show who is really causing more trouble.

In Small Groups today- you will be reading a chapter from “Boy” by Roald Dahl and finding evidence that answers the question/prompt- Whom does Dahl describe as causing more trouble: the boys or the adults? Use information from one moment in the book to show who is really causing more trouble.

First step- go through your chapter with your group and make a t-chart in your notebook. Write out the evidence from the text on one side, and on the other write who is causing the trouble.

Second step- in your notebooks, write out an example paragraph to answer the prompt. After your paragraph is reviewed and edited, write it out on chart paper. Make sure it is color coded- GREEN to answer the question/your claim, YELLOW for evidence, and ORANGE for your reasoning.

I think the adults cause the most trouble in the memoir *Boy*, written by Roald Dahl. I think this because Mr. Thwaites tells his son all of these crazy stories and expects him to blindly trust him because he is a doctor. In paragraph 6, the text says, Thwaites's father, who was a doctor, had said that they were made from rats' blood. The father had given his young son a lecture about Liquorice Bootlaces when he had caught him eating one in bed. 'Every ratcatcher in the country', the father had said, 'takes his rats to the Liquorice Bootlace Factory, and the manager pays tuppence for each rat. Many a ratcatcher has become a millionaire by selling his dead rats to the Factory.' Thwaites's father is trying to make his son scared so he doesn't eat too much candy.
