Dance IV Syllabus

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Course Description: Dance IV is a full year course in which students will further their foray into the world of movement by continuing to study the four main areas of dance education: Performance, Composition, Critique and Appreciation, and Dance History.

Course Expectations: Dance IV students will expand on the knowledge and skills previously learned in Dance I/II in the areas of jazz, tap, modern, ballet, lyrical, and hip hop. At least once a marking period, students will participate in a choreography project, as well as devoting class time to dance history, and performance analysis and critique. Performance in the end of the year recital is mandatory and will be counted as the final exam grade. The following is a breakdown of the first marking period in terms of dance genres and assignments.
