Community	David W. Butler High School is located in Matthews, a community east of Charlotte which is a major metropolitan city located in central North Carolina.
School	David W. Butler is a community-based high school that is a part of the Charlotte- Mecklenburg School System. Operating since 1997, our school was named in honor of David Watkins Butler, an outstanding teacher who perished in a house fire while saving the lives of his family. During the 2013-14 and 2014-15 school years, David W. Butler High School exceeded expected student academic growth. In 2014, David W. Butler High School was recognized by US News and World Report as the #1 high school in CMS and the 5th highest rating school in North Carolina. Our Graduation Rate in 2018 was 91.6%.
