How To Crop An Image

CROPPING IN SNAPSEED

PART 1



Cropping is SO important. Often an image can go from plain to wow, with a simple crop. Sometimes you might have unwanted parts in the background, or you didn't zoom in enough.

How to Use the Tune Tool

The tune tool is where you are going to do most of your editing for any particular image. It has all the tools you would find in your basic camera editing app, plus other tools which can have a dramatic improvement on your image.

When you have your image looking perfect, and you are ready to post or print, it's always a good idea to sharpen it. You want to be careful to not overdo it though.

Histogram

Histogram is a very important tool in photography and videography. Histogram is useful for getting perfect exposure. Understanding histogram is must because you can't rely on the camera's screen for the exposure.



White Balance

1. Often times your photo will have an unnatural color (too yellow, too blue, or too green or too pink)
1. Edit that photo first using **White Balance** and then **Tune Image**



Power of Cropping

You should always consider if your photo needs to be cropped! Please make sure you are looking at every edge of the image and ask yourself if it would look better if it were removed.

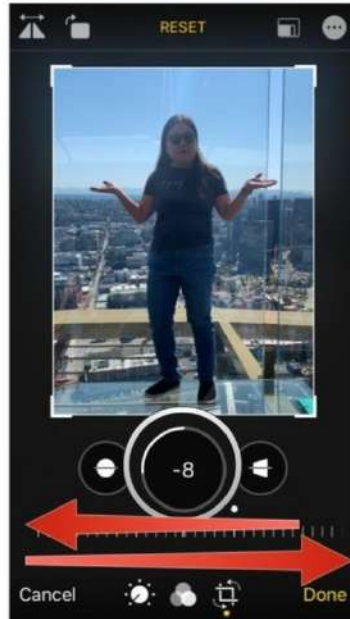
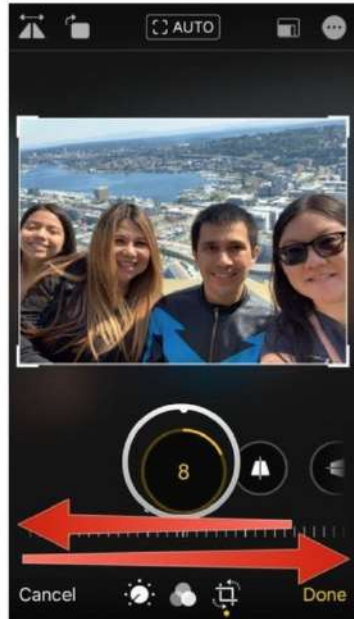


Power of Cropping in Action



Straighten Your Image

If you need to straighten out the image **vertically** or **horizontally**, tap on either **Vertical** or **Horizontal** (located next to the default **Straighten** option).



Adjust the **slider** until you are satisfied with the results.
